




Swimming Success for Nathan Holmes

I was delighted to hear that **Nathan Holmes** (10N) has qualified for nationals in swimming again this year.

Nathan has qualified for **two events for British nationals**, which is the **top 25 in the country**, 50 and 100m freestyle. In addition to this, he is part of a medley relay team who have also qualified.

British nationals will take place in Glasgow this year at the start of the Summer holidays. He will then swim at the English home nations summer meet in Sheffield the following week - this event is the next 20 fastest swimmers in England and he has qualified for the 200IM and the 50 breaststroke at this meet.

International Women in Engineering Day at Leyland Trucks

On 24th June, four of us were invited to Leyland Trucks for their women in engineering event. When we arrived, we were greeted by seven women from all different areas of the business including engineering, IT, purchasing, finance and a prototype apprentice. They introduced themselves and told us about their background leading up to their current role in the business. We learned a lot about the different career pathways you can take and also some background information about the company.



We were then given a 3D CAD demonstration showing us how the trucks were made from the start to the end of the production line. Next we were taken on a tour along the production line and saw at first-hand how the trucks were made at each station. We were all thoroughly impressed with how at each station the engineers had just four and a half minutes to do their job fully whilst the chassis was constantly moving so that the trucks were completely operational in seven hours. At lunch we had an in depth conversation with one of the female engineers, Rebecca Wood, who is currently in her third year of a prototype apprenticeship. It was very beneficial to hear her insight on the business and also receive a few tips about the apprenticeship programmes from her. We were also invited to sit in some of the different trucks, including a fire truck from the early 1900s and a very modern and big XF truck.


After lunch, we given the opportunity to take part in a practical audit exercise where we teamed up with the other girls to find the defects on a truck. It was quite difficult as some of the parts are very small. However, our team was the most successful at finding what was wrong with the vehicle. Finally, we returned to the conference room where we asked any final questions and the female engineers gave us a few final words of wisdom. All four of us enjoyed the day immensely and will never look at a truck in the same way again.





Online Safety Newsletter: July 2019

More control over your broadband

Do you have Vodafone or Virgin Media Broadband? If yes, they have their own apps which give you further control over your internet access.

Vodafone Broadband App

- View and manage all devices on your network.
- Control when your Wi-Fi is on.
- Receive notifications when devices join your network for the first time.

Virgin Media Connect App

- See how many devices are connected to your WiFi.
- Pause access to the internet for particular devices.



PEGI ratings explained



If you see this rating on a game then it means the game refers to or depicts the use of illegal drugs, alcohol or tobacco. Games with this content descriptor are always PEGI 16 or PEGI 18 meaning you should be over 16 or 18 years of age to play the game.

TikTok Update (users must be 13+)

What is TikTok? Users can watch musical clips, record 60 second clips, edit them and add special effects. You must be over 13 years of age to use it so if you do choose to allow your child to set up an account then we recommend users have a private account to control who can see their videos and who can send them messages. Tik Tok also includes a 'Restricted mode' to limit the appearance of content that may be inappropriate. More information is available here:

Does your child have an Apple Device?

Have you set up Family Sharing with Apple? Family Sharing allows you to create an Apple ID for those under 13 (they are not allowed to do it themselves) or for children over 13 who have already set up their ID, you can add it to your family group. Once set up, you can limit what content your child can access and also enable 'Ask to Buy' (enabled by default for children under 13 and you'll be asked to set it up when adding anyone 13 – 18 years of age.)

With Ask to Buy, whenever a child tries to purchase or download something (from iTunes, Apple Books, App Store, In-App Purchases, or iCloud storage), a request will be sent to you to review and either approve or decline the request.

LIKEE App (formerly LIKE Video) 16+



Rated as 17+ on the App store

LIKEE, which has recently rebranded from LIKE, is a short video editor and video sharing app. It has over 200 million users worldwide. The app allows users to create and edit videos and to add emoji stickers and face filters. Due to the age of people accessing this app, suggestive content can be found on here.


Privacy Settings

All profiles on LIKEE are **public** which means that **everything** your child posts on there can be seen by others. The app also includes private messaging.

If your child does use this app then there are several privacy options which we would recommend reviewing:

- **who can message me:** set to 'friends' or 'disable'
- **enable others to save my video:** Likee allows other users to download other people's videos (which they can then share/upload to other places) so we would strongly recommend disabling this option.

- **enable others to comment on my videos:** if disabled then others cannot comment on your video.



Blocking Users

This app does give users the ability to block other users so like with everything your child accesses online, make sure your child understands how to do this.



In-app purchases

You must be aware that whilst this app is free to download, additional in app purchases in the form of diamonds can be made, ranging from £0.99 – £99 per item! They're very easy to purchase with one tap and then a confirmation tap.
