adamsl@broughtonhigh.co.uk. Our rates are highly competitive and all income generated will be used to improve the facilities for the benefit of all pupils.

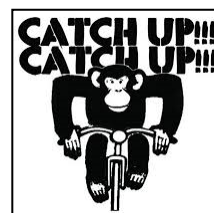

Matt Lee, Operational Firearms Commander for Lancashire Police, returned to Broughton last Friday to speak to Year 8 and Year 9 pupils to promote the **Choose Life Not The Knife** campaign.

He delivered an extremely informative presentation which included the dangers of carrying a knife, statistical facts about knife crime in Lancashire and the law relating to knife crime:

- If you carry a knife you could go to prison for 4 years.
- You don't have to have your hand on a knife to be convicted for murder. If you are with the person responsible you could be found guilty due to 'Joint Enterprise'.
- The most at risk age group across the country are boys and men ages 14 - 24.
- In Lancashire, the average age of knife crime offenders is 17 and the average age of victims is 16.
- 8 out of 10 people who get attacked with a knife know their attacker.
- Most knife crime occurs in the street and involves alcohol.
- 7 out of 10 young people who end up in A&E with a knife injury have been stabbed with their own knife; carrying a blade puts you at risk.



Pupils returned to class and discussed the presentation with each other and their teachers. This is what they said:

"It made me think about what happens to people's friends and family and their future lives."

"I did not realise a pen knife was regarded as an illegal weapon."

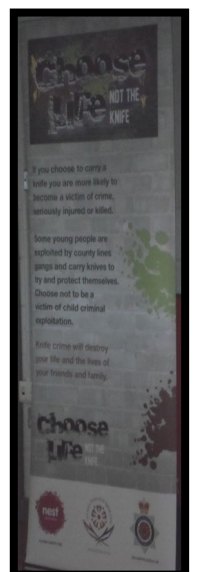
"I learnt about Joint Enterprise and this surprised me."

"I was shocked about the weapons armed police carry, but happy that no one has ever been shot by the Police in Lancashire."

"The wounds shocked me and how quickly someone can lose blood."

"I already knew not to carry a knife but I learnt about the consequences."

Broughton would like to thank Matt for coming into school and making us think about the issues around knife crime and gang culture. He encouraged us to think about making the right choices and the consequences of our actions, not just on ourselves, but on our friends and families too.

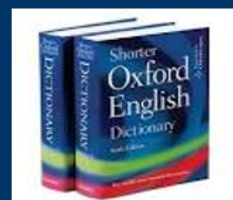

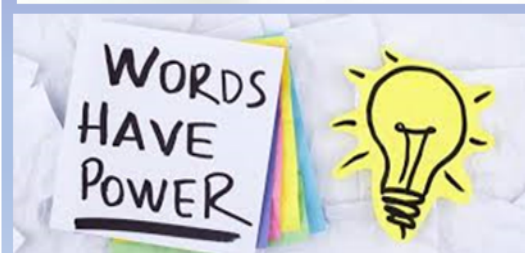
