The **North West Ambulance Service** has started their training courses in our Computing suites. This is to enable new staff to respond to the increased calls over the coming weeks.







Acoustica (who make our Mixcraft software) have offered all our pupils a **temporary licence to use Mixcraft 9 at home**. This is the same software we use in KS3. Unfortunately, it only works

on Windows. However, for those pupils with Windows at home, it will give them a chance to experiment with the software and compose.

Please note, **the software will work with PCs** but will not work on Chromebooks or Macs. The licence will expire once all the pandemic is over and all schools are re-opened.

We aim to reply to you within one working day and you should get an immediate bounce-back to confirm we received your text. Texts will not be seen outside of normal working hours. If you need help before you hear back from us, contact a member of school staff or your doctor. Our text number does not receive voice calls or MMS picture messages. We support messaging from UK mobile numbers only (which does not include messages sent from landlines, international mobile numbers and some 'number masking' mobile apps). Prevent the school nurse from sending messages to you by texting STOP to our number. Please respect your schools mobile phone policy. Messages are charged at your usual rate.
