We are now beginning to analyse our GCSE results in a little more detail. As you can see, pupils' attainment at Broughton is significantly above national averages in the core subjects of English, Maths and Science.





It is a similar pattern in all other subjects too. Whilst exam performance is not the sole indicator of a successful school, it is re-assuring to know that all pupils are well taught and, if they apply themselves, they can enjoy academic success.

Finally, once again, may I remind you that it is our **Open Evening** on **Thursday 19th September** and **school closes at 1.00pm.** Each of the bus companies is aware of this arrangement. The school is also **closed on Friday 20th September**, because it is an 'in service education training' (INSET) day. School is **open as normal** from **Monday 23rd September**, when it is our **Open Day** for prospective parents and their children. Attendance Matters

At the beginning of a new academic year, it seems an ideal time to highlight the importance of a good attendance here at Broughton. **Why is attendance so important?** An attendance of 90% appears positive; most of us would be impressed if we achieved it in a test. However, just a drop in 10% can have a bigger impact than you probably think. An attendance of 90% equates to approximately 20 days absence throughout an academic year, whereas 80% means a pupil has around 38 days absence. There has been a wealth of research undertaken in this area which reveals a direct link between good attendance and success, both in school and beyond. We therefore want your child to reap similar benefits.

98% attendance = fewer than 4 days absent from school

95% attendance = fewer than 10 days absent from school

90% attendance = 4 weeks absent from school

85% attendance = $5 \frac{1}{2}$ weeks absent from school

80% attendance = $7 \frac{1}{2}$ weeks absent from school

The impact goes further than just GCSE examinations. One of the first things to be entered on a college application is the attendance record and, we know from experience, that this can often be a deciding factor in the competition for places.




