From September 2020 we shall be using all relevant attainment data to allocate pupils to the most appropriate teaching group in each subject. Whilst there still will be some groupings based on ability and

attainment, there will not be the same rigid, strict setting  $1 \longrightarrow 7$  we have used in previous years. We are making this change because we have found that the evidence for a pupil being placed in Set 3 as opposed to Set 6 can

be imprecise. Furthermore, if a pupil is placed in one of the 'bottom sets' this may result in low aspirations and expectations. Put simply, we are



grouping the majority, middle ability pupils much more evenly. There will be no numerical labelling of groups. Please be assured we shall continue to meet the specific needs of those pupils with particular learning needs and the most able in each subject by grouping these pupils accordingly. As always, we are determined

to ensure that all pupils are encouraged, stretched and supported to achieve their very best in every subject by every teacher.


