

Dear Parents,

I hope you had an enjoyable half-term holiday. Thank you to all parents of Year 7 pupils who attended the

Parents' Evening just before the break. Attendance was 95% which shows your commitment and willingness to be involved in your son/daughter's education. All parents were invited to complete a questionnaire, so we can react and actively respond to any issues associated with a pupil settling in to life at Broughton. Every parent also received a copy of 'Armistice Runner'. Please encourage your son/daughter to read regularly for 15-30 minutes daily. Arguably it is the best way you can help with your son/daughter's education.

By now I am sure the majority of you will have accessed ClassCharts to monitor behaviour. I thought you may be interested in some whole school analysis from the first half term.



As you can see, over 15,720 (green/positive) points (almost half the pie chart) have been awarded for good work in class. At the same point last year the total for good work was 12,700. Also encouraging to see such high totals for thorough, detailed homework and appropriate use of word of the week. Some of the highest 'other positive' include involvement in extra-curricular activities, reading reward and good manners. Unsurprisingly, the highest negative (red) total is for unacceptable homework. In addition to being

intrinsically valuable, ClassChart points also equate to end of term

rewards.

Thank you to all families who hosted the German exchange pupils from Bonndorf. They all had a wonderful time and no doubt your son or

> daughter is looking forward to the return visit to Germany at the end of March 2020. As well as attending numerous lessons, the exchange pupils visited Lancaster, Liverpool, and, of course, Blackpool. We also had a visit from the Mayor of Preston, David Borrow, who answered questions from the Bonndorf pupils. He also



witnessed a ceremony involving the burial of a time capsule containing memories and thoughts of all those involved in the 40th celebration of this exchange between our two schools.









28-30 hours per week (Shift work)

Or 2 to 3 A levels for a degree in human resources management or related subject. You can get into this role through a HR consultant or partner higher apprenticeship.

## **Examples:**


The actor gesticulated wildly during his passionate speech.

## Revision Techniques


Active revision is the key!

Did you know that creating things dramatically helps your memory and retention skills?

### Mind map

- Pupils use plain paper landscape style.
- They start with a central image/title preferably using different colours.
- Thick branches radiate from the centre with the big ideas and then become thinner with the supporting details. They should use different colours for each branch.
- They write single words along the branches. They should try to make the words fill up the branch length.
- They can draw simple pictures or symbols to help create associations.
