Dear Parent/Carer,

It has been an absolute pleasure to meet the pupils and staff during my first week as Headteacher. I spoke to all Year groups on Monday in separate, socially distanced assemblies, and I was extremely impressed by the way they entered the hall and listened carefully to my presentation. The warm welcome I have received from staff and pupils has been overwhelming and the number of pupils actively coming to say hello and introducing themselves to me has definitely reinforced my initial feelings about the 'family' atmosphere at Broughton High School.

I spoke to the pupils during my assembly about the part they have to play in the 'team' at Broughton High School. As a keen sportsman myself, I explained the importance of what being in a team means and that we all have to play our part and take responsibility for our own actions. It is clear to me that the pupils have listened to this advice. As I have walked around school and visited lessons, the focus, concentration and hard work, alongside sensible behaviour around school, has been impressive.

One aspect that does concern me however is that some pupils are wearing their uniform incorrectly. I would like to take this opportunity to ask you for your support in ensuring that together we address this issue and that the Broughton High School uniform is worn correctly, at all times, by all pupils, from the 26<sup>th</sup> April. The uniform expectations are listed below and have been in place for a number of years.

**For Boys:**

Grey trousers with logo  
Plain white shirt with stiffened collar (not fitted)  
Plain black or grey socks  
Sensible plain black shoes, not canvas, no trainers

**For Girls:**

Navy pleated knee-length skirt with logo or  
Navy school trousers with logo  
Plain navy or black tights or plain navy socks  
No leggings or socks over tights  
Plain white shirt with stiffened collar (not fitted)  
Sensible plain black shoes, not canvas, no trainers

**For All:**

Only wearing a watch and a single pair of plain ear studs as a maximum amount of jewellery  
Any other facial or body piercing is not allowed  
Not wearing make-up, fake tan and nail varnish or false nails  
Ensuring hair colouring is natural and discreet  
Extreme hairstyles, cuts and adornments are inappropriate for school  
Hoodies must not be worn under a blazer on the way to or from school

Progress Leaders are already addressing this issue and speaking to pupils who are wearing their uniform incorrectly or wearing make-up or false tan. I have seen a noticeable improvement already and with your support I am sure we can ensure that all our pupils wear their uniform to the same standard every day from the 26<sup>th</sup> April. If your child is in Year 11 and has grown out of their skirt please let Mrs Boardman know; we will then loan them a brand-new skirt until they leave school. Many thanks in advance for your help and support with this matter. If you are struggling with any aspect of our uniform please contact your child's Progress Leader and we will do all we can to help.

Tomorrow, I will be meeting all Year 11 pupils to talk them through some of the best revision techniques for their upcoming assessments which will allow teachers to allocate an accurate GCSE grade. You will be aware that Year 11 teachers will be assessing the pupils from the 4<sup>th</sup> May in order to award an appropriate grade GCSE for your child. The pupils will be completing written assessments under exam conditions and will receive their final GCSE grades on 12<sup>th</sup> August. Having spoken to a significant number of Year 11 pupils, I know they are working extremely hard in preparation for the assessments and that they will give their very best over the next few weeks. It was wonderful to meet Sam Horton (Head Boy), Jenna Culshaw (Head Girl), Rishi Parekh (Deputy Head Boy) and Alex Morris (Deputy Head Girl) who offered some sensible suggestions and insights into how we can help Year 11 pupils over the next few weeks. We are also trying to finalise an official leaving date for Year 11's and will inform you immediately when we have a final collective decision.

Information regarding the end of year assessments for Year 7-10 will be published in next week's newsletter.

## Bedrock Vocabulary

Here at Broughton we have invested in an innovative literacy improvement tool called **Bedrock Vocabulary**. It is a website that helps children to learn very important academic vocabulary. Did you know that children with wide vocabularies make excellent progress at school and in further education? We currently already run this programme with Year 9 but have decided to additionally launch this initiative with Year 7 pupils as we are confident it will offer an opportunity for learning enrichment outside of the classroom.



As your child progresses through this curriculum, they will study hundreds of words, whilst reading fiction and non-fiction texts regularly. They will also fill in an online vocabulary notebook to practise using this vocabulary, and you can see and edit this yourself!

Why not help your child to make even greater progress by logging on to see how they are getting on? You will be able see the vocabulary your child is learning, which we encourage you to use in conversation at home. As each post-test is completed, data will appear in the dashboard.

You can go directly to the site and create your own account now.

- Step 1: Visit <https://app.bedrocklearning.org>.
- Step 2: Click on the 'Parent/Teacher' tab.
- Step 3: Complete the parent sign-up sheet and enter the codes provided to you by the school and create an account. (This will be sent to you in an email)
- Step 4: Check your email for your password, and then log in. Be sure to check your junk folder if no email arrives.

The pupils will be required to complete **two Bedrock sessions of learning per week and this will be their designated homework**; this should take on average 10-15 minutes per session. Your child's English teacher will access their vocabulary notebook and test records in order to monitor progress.



It is a way of displaying how an organisation is structured and who is in charge of who in a workplace.




9. The **Director** is the person at the **top** of the organisation chart. They have the **most control, authority and responsibility** and the people at the bottom have the least control, authority and responsibility.

## Chemistry

## Years 10 and 11

1. Two atoms can be linked together by a **bond**.

2. **Noble gases/Group 0 in the periodic table** is the group of elements which are stable and do not form compounds easily.

3. **Electrons** are sub-atomic particles of atoms which take part in chemical reactions.

4. An **ion** is an atom that is changed because it has lost or gained one or more electrons.

5. An **ionic compound** is formed by the loss and gain of electrons.

6. A **covalent bond** is formed by sharing electron pairs within molecules.

7. In oxygen and carbon dioxide, the atoms share two pairs of electrons, these are **double covalent bonds**.

8. The forces of attraction between molecules compared to the bonds within molecules **are relatively weak**.

9. Simple molecules are **poor conductors of electricity** at room temperature.

10. Simple molecules, such as methane, have low melting points because they have **weak intermolecular forces of attraction between them**.

**Years 7 and 8** Review 2 will be published on **Monday 10<sup>th</sup> May**.



A meal deal represents great value at £2.40 and pupils have an abundance of choice at break and lunch.




## Read to Lead – Year 9
