Dear Parent/Guardian,

As we approach the last few days of the Autumn Term I wanted to take the opportunity to praise our pupils for the superb way they represent the school on a daily basis. Pupils in all years returned to school in September after lengthy periods of isolation, lock down and on-line learning and it is important to recognise how well they have responded to our return to 'normal' in school this term. Both myself and members of the Senior Leadership Team spend a considerable amount of time visiting lessons on a daily basis and the repeated message we all agree on is that there is a superb atmosphere for learning around school and that pupils' behaviour in lessons and around school is excellent.

Thank you to all the parents who have responded to our appeal for donations of food for our chosen charity 'Luv Preston' food bank which is run in partnership with local churches, The Freedom Centre and St Christopher's Lea. Any dry goods that you are able to donate will be much appreciated and will go to a very worthy cause. The response so far has been extremely generous. A reminder that on Friday we will be holding a non-uniform day with proceeds going to our chosen Charity Teenage Cancer Trust. The cost is £1 and can be paid through ParentPay.

When we return to school in January we are required to test pupils again for Covid-19. As we have done previously we will be working with a dedicated team of volunteers to swiftly test the pupils and return them to lessons. Year 11 pupils have now finished their mocks and having spoken to a number of them I asked them what they have learned from the process. Responses such as 'plan my revision carefully', 'be more organised' and 'give myself more time to revise' were common but all the pupils I spoke to were positive about the experience and now have a better understanding of how the final exams will be if they go ahead in the summer term. All Year 11 pupils received a 'chocolate waffle' today at break time to congratulate them on their efforts over the last two weeks. Mock exams results day will be held on Friday 14<sup>th</sup> January 2022.

This week members of the Music department will be carol singing alongside the school brass band around the village of Broughton. They have been practicing hard and sound fantastic. I look forward to seeing and hearing them bringing some festive cheer to the residents of Broughton.

Thank you to all parents who have expressed an interest in the position of parent governor here at school. As mentioned in earlier newsletters it is an extremely important role that will help mould the future and next steps of the school. The deadline for the submission of nominations has now passed and I will keep you informed in the New Year of the appointment made.

### Music Years 7, 8, 9

1. Traditionally, the blues is performed in a **12-bar** pattern.
2. **Chords I, IV & V** (1, 4 and 5) are used in blues music. If you were in the key of C, chord 'I' would be C, chord 'IV' would be F and chord 'V' would be G.
3. The full name for a piano is a '**fortepiano**' because it can play a wide range of dynamics (volumes). **Forte means loud and piano means soft** so the translation is literally a '**loudsoft**'.
4. The most expensive instrument in the world is the "**Lady Blunt**" **Stradivarius Violin** (made in 1721) which last sold in 2011 for almost £10,000,000!
5. A two-beat note is called a **minim**.
6. The long, sustained note played by bagpipes, while the tune is played on the chanter, is called a **drone**.
7. The small lines that sit above or below the staff are called **Ledger Lines**. They are used to sit notes on, above or below.
8. Lots of people consider any music played by an orchestra as 'Classical Music'. However, the classical period was between approximately **1750 and 1820**. Not very long at all!
9. **John Williams** is the prolific composer who is responsible for the soundtracks to Star Wars, Indiana Jones, Jurassic Park, Superman, ET, Harry Potter, Jaws, Home Alone and Schindler's List, amongst many more. John Williams is Mr Shepherd's favourite film composer and still producing incredible film music at 89 years old!
10. **Historically, the flute was made out of wood** but in the 1830s a German musician and inventor called Theobald Boehm created the flute that we recognise today out of metal.

Pupils in Years 7, 8 and 9 will be tested on these



facts, during form time this week.

### **SCHOOL BUS SERVICE CHANGES FROM 4<sup>th</sup> JANUARY 2022**

I am writing to let you know of some forthcoming changes to your school bus services.

Following a recent review into Broughton High School's bus services, we have made a few changes to the routes and timetables of some services which should improve pupils journey times and provide additional seating capacity.

Please see the list below for brief details of the services and their changes:

#### **484: Longsands – Broughton HS**

- Service will now operate via Sharoe Green Lane, Tower Lane, Broadwood Drive, Levensgarth Avenue & run a revised timetable.

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#### **572: Preston via Fulwood – Broughton HS**

- Service will no longer operate via Sharoe Green Lane, Tower Lane, Broadwood Drive, Levensgarth Avenue. Service will operate via Garstang Road and Lightfoot Lane and will now serve Wychnor & run a revised timetable.

#### **696: Cottam – Broughton**

- Service will commence from Cottam Ancient Oak, omitting Wychnor & run a revised timetable.

Please see separate document for the full list of Broughton High School's bus service routes and timetables.

Students who have travel passes issued by the county council, who are affected by these changes, will be notified directly and sent a new travel pass.

I'd be grateful if you could also circulate this information and publicity with parents to ensure full coverage of everyone who uses the school bus service network.
