Dear Parent/Guardian,

The return to school and a new term has been extremely positive and the staff have all commented on the superb attitude of the children during the first week of the New Year. The pupils have looked exceptionally smart in their uniforms on their return to school and we have only had to remind a very small number of pupils about wearing their uniform correctly. All uniform can be purchased from Monkhouse Schoolwear (Preston) or from The Uniform and Leisurewear Company (Garstang). Please remember that our uniform policy states 'no extreme hairstyles' and this definitely means no patterns shaved into the hairline. Ties should be knotted correctly and go to the waistband of trousers or skirts. Shirts should be tucked in at all times. Skirts should be worn correctly and at the knee. Shoes must be plain black (no trainers). Outdoor coats should be plain black or blue and must never be worn around school. They are to be stored in a bag or a locker. We do not allow coats or hooded tops with motifs or emblems, or jewellery (apart from plain studded earrings).

As I mentioned last week, the theme for assemblies was kindness and in my closing message I asked the pupils to go out of their way in future to be kind at every opportunity to their friends and family. Whilst on the theme of kindness we received a lovely letter from 'Luv Preston' thanking the pupils and parents for their generous donations to their food bank before Christmas.

This Friday we will be sharing the Year 11 Mock Exam grades with the pupils which will give them an indication of their progress so far and grades from their performance in the mock exam period. This event is organised to replicate the examination results day in August and will give the Year 11 pupils a taste of what this day will feel like in the summer. We are still awaiting confirmation from the exam boards

regarding how Year 11 exams will look in the summer. When we have further information, we will write to Year 11 parents immediately and keep you updated.

Please can I remind Year 7 parents that 'Parents' Evening' will be held on Thursday evening between 4pm and 7pm. Please ensure you have booked your appointments and have checked how to log onto the 'Parent Booking' system in advance of your appointments to avoid any unnecessary technical difficulties.

Latin Expressions

Years 7, 8, 9

Approximately (circa) half of our language derives from Latin and there are still many Latin expressions in common use.

- 1. **Ad lib**: derives from the Latin ad libitum, literally 'according to pleasure'. In other words, making it up as you go along.
- 2. Ad nauseam: 'until nausea', usually in the sense of 'on and on until the listener is bored'.
- 3. **E.g. exempli gratia**: 'for example'.
- 4. **Modus operandi**: 'way of working' for a person or organisation.
- 5. **NB: nota bene** which literally means 'note well'.
- 6. **Per annum or p.a**: 'each year', usually used to refer to salaries and often abbreviated, as in £50,000 p.a.
- ✓ write them down ✓ say them out loud get someone to test you
- 7. **Per capita**: literally means 'by the heads', as 'the equivalent per capita annual income is £24,000'.
- 8. **P.S. post scriptum**: 'after writing'. Used if you want to add something to a letter or document after you had finished it.
- 9. **Quid pro quo**: 'something for something', giving something back in exchange for something else.
- 10. **Status quo**: 'the existing state of affairs' means leaving things exactly as they are.

Pupils in Years 7, 8 and 9 will be tested on these facts, during form time this week.






How can you keep up-to-date with your child's application in school?
