Dear Parent/Guardian,

Thank you to all parents who are battling through the temporary traffic lights in Broughton village to get your children into school on time. It is another traffic issue that we have had to face but your patience is greatly appreciated. Hopefully the lights will be removed soon.

This weekend saw another group of intrepid explorers setting out on their Duke of Edinburgh practice expedition. 27 pupils embarked on their walk from school to the Plough at Eaves across country and arrived safely at their destination a few hours later. Thank you to all the staff involved again this weekend and for giving freely of your time to provide this wonderful opportunity for our Year 10 pupils. The Duke of Edinburgh award scheme is another example of the importance of 'getting involved' at Broughton High School. There have been a huge number of extra-curricular clubs on offer so far this academic year that many of our pupils have been involved with, but suggestions from our recent pupil survey highlight that we can do even more. We will be discussing some other opportunities and clubs from this feedback and aiming to offer an even wider range of enrichment opportunities for our pupils over the next term.

The feedback from our recent pupil survey has given us some really positive feedback and as always with surveys, given us some ideas to further improve the day to day school experience for our pupils. The overwhelming majority of pupils feel safe in school, enjoy school, feel challenged in lessons, agree that behaviour is good, feel that homework is set regularly and that it is challenging, understand what bullying is and that teachers respond quickly if bullying occurs. They also stated that Broughton High School encourages them to be kind and friendly to others, encourages them to be independent and take on responsibilities, with a huge majority of pupils agreeing with this statement. We must never be complacent and will continue to work to ensure every pupil has the best school experience and further opportunities to get involved with a wider variety of extra-curricular clubs. We will also be looking to further develop other ways to enhance our rewards system to ensure there is consistency in ensuring our pupils receive positive recognition for their hard work and effort in school. We will keep you updated regarding our progress in this area in future newsletters.

With this in mind, we will be holding our 'Badge Assemblies' next week which will recognise those pupils who have received 100 reward points or more so far this year. Every pupil who has received 100 reward points will be awarded with their 'Bronze Badge' award. So far this year, pupils have received 57,186 reward points and 8259 since we returned in January.

The current reward point distribution is below. I am hopeful Year 10 and 11 teachers will be looking for more opportunities to reward pupils for excellence to help them catch up to the pupils in Year 7, 8 and 9!

The 'Learn it Challenge' this week is based on 'British Values'. Tolerance: An acceptance that we don't all share the same beliefs and values.

Mutual respect: Respecting those values, ideas and beliefs of others whilst not imposing our

own onto them.

Please ensure that you have read the information regarding booking and how to log on in advance of the evening to ensure there are no issues on the evening. Year 10 Class Readers


