Dear Parent/Guardian,

Last week I was pleased to welcome two Headteachers to Broughton High School to spend the day with us, Mrs Karen Pomeroy from Penwortham Girls' and Mr Iain Siddall from Hodgson Academy. The aim of this full day visit was to gain their external views on our school and to speak to staff and pupils about life at Broughton and the developments we have made over the last 12 months. Both Headteachers shared some superb feedback about the learning environment, pupil engagement in lessons, the behaviour and manners of pupils around school and about the amazing litter free facilities we have. Although I witness these things on a daily basis it is extremely encouraging to hear this feedback from two experienced Headteachers. I will be visiting their schools over the next three months and conducting a similar exercise.

Year 9 Parents' Evening and Options Evening is this Thursday from 4pm and will be our first face to face parents' evening since Covid-19 started. To ensure we keep Covid-safe, we will be using four venues for appointments, the sports hall, the gymnasium, the Year 11 Lounge and Mr Church will host an 'Options' talk in the Senior Dining Room. Please can I ask you to sign in when you arrive in the sports hall and you will then be informed where each department is based. It is really important that pupils accompany their parents to this evening so they can share in the feedback from their teachers. Pupils attending must wear full school uniform. Year 11 Parents' Evening is being held the following Thursday, 31st April. The same arrangements will apply.

On Friday 1st April, we will be holding a non-uniform day and pupils will be asked to donate £1 in support of Ukraine alongside a range of other activities coordinated by Mr Tomlin and a number of our pupils. We will also be conducting our end of term rewards assemblies where pupils will be recognised for their effort and excellence in class during this half term.

Today we have opened our new outdoor dining facility. It is a wonderful addition to our catering facilities and allows our pupils to quickly access, sandwiches, soups, baked potatoes and salads and sit indoor or outside with their friends in this new area. As you can see from the pictures below it is a wonderful space for our pupils.



Last week we held our annual Year 6 Science Festival where over 60 pupils from some of our feeder primary schools attended school for the day and explored the world of science. Pupils were able to conduct a number of experiments including burning fuels and building and launching air powered rockets. It was great to see so many Year 6 pupils totally engrossed in learning here at Broughton.

I am sure you will join me in wishing her the best of luck. Last week we appointed Mr Jack Cowen to the position of Teacher of PE and Mathematics. Jack completed his first teaching placement at Broughton High School in the Autumn Term. He will be an excellent addition to the team from September.

School will close at 3.00pm on Friday 1st April and will re-open after Easter at 8.40am on Tuesday 19th April.


