Dear Parent/Guardian,

Welcome back after the half term holiday. I hope you managed to have a restful break with friends and family and enjoyed the extended weekend due to the Platinum Jubilee Celebrations.

The theme in assemblies this week has been 'Positive Relationships' and I have talked to the pupils about the importance of building and maintaining positive relationships with their friends, other pupils, family members and members of staff. My suggestions to the pupils were to focus on the following areas:

- 1. Accept and celebrate differences.
- 2. Listen effectively.
- 3. Give people your time.
- 4. Develop your communication skills.
- 5. Manage mobile technology.
- 6. Learn to give and take feedback.
- 7. Learn to trust more.
- 8. Develop empathy.

It is amazing to see all the positive relationships already evident in and around school, I am sure that the assemblies this week will help develop these even more.

Today we say goodbye to our Year 11 cohort who finish their formal lessons. The way the pupils have prepared themselves for their GCSE exams has been exceptional and their attitude and conduct throughout has been exemplary. They have been a credit to the school. Year 11 pupils will now only attend for scheduled revision sessions and timetabled exams. I will update you with the exam successes of this year group when we return in September.

Over the last few weeks pupils have been completing their end of year assessments and again the pupils have worked extremely hard in their preparation. It is clear that the pupils take their learning and their assessments seriously and that performance in these assessments is important to them. We will be feeding the information from the exams back to the pupils in classes over the next two weeks and every child will receive a report towards the end of term highlighting their progress this year.

May I remind you of our school uniform policy:

- Skirts should be knee length.
- A single pair of plain stud earrings in the lobe only. Other facial or body piercings are not allowed.
 No other jewellery except for a wrist watch or articles worn for religious reasons.

- No chewing gum permitted.




Interviewers wanted!



In order to qualify, you could do a law degree, then complete the postgraduate Legal Practice Course or do a non-law degree followed by the Common Professional Examination or Graduate Diploma in Law

You could do a solicitor degree apprenticeship to qualify as a solicitor. This route usually takes around 5 years and you'll need your employer's support to do it.

You could start with a legal firm and do on-the-job training like the Chartered Institute of Legal Executives (CILEx) Level 6 Professional Diploma in Higher Law and Practice.











