Dear Parent/Guardian,

Having spent a significant amount of time in lessons this week it has been an absolute pleasure to see our teachers teaching and our pupils learning, in a very calm and purposeful manner. The relationships that are built between the staff and pupils at Broughton is extremely special and never taken for granted. I have asked all teachers to re-visit their classroom expectations with all pupils this week to ensure that good behaviour and attitudes to learning continue to be a real strength here at Broughton.

We will be visited by the NHS vaccination team this week in school. All pupils need to come to school in their normal school uniform which is different to the information that was previously shared which stated that pupils receiving a vaccination should attend in school wearing their PE shirt. We have been fortunate that numbers of positive cases of Covid-19 have been extremely low and below the recommended figures that would need us to take further precautionary actions. We will continue to monitor cases and review our plans if and when required.

Last week I met with members of Broughton Parish Council regarding traffic around Broughton, parking at the start and the end of the school day and the possibilities of a crossing being put in place on Woodplumpton Lane and Garstang Road. I have mentioned in previous newsletters about the school and local community in the village trying to work in harmony which is something I know we can achieve. Dropping pupils off and picking them up on Woodplumpton Lane has become extremely dangerous for pedestrians, cyclists and other road users and I would like to ask you to try and avoid dropping off and picking up in this area from now on. Please can I also ask you to avoid parking over residents' drives and to switch off your engines to reduce unnecessary fumes. We will be working closely with the Parish Council to develop further ideas to resolve the congestion in the village and will keep you updated of any further developments. Your assistance in this matter is greatly appreciated.

On Friday 22nd October, we will be holding our end of half term rewards assemblies. Every class teacher has nominated a pupil for excellence and for effort in their subject with a number of pastoral awards also being presented. Each year group will have an individual presentation assembly during the morning and will receive certificates and prizes for their efforts. These assemblies will run at the end of every half term from now on. Rewards point 'Badge' assemblies will take place after half term. Our reward point total has reached an impressive 20443 which equates to £204.43 to donate to Teenage Cancer UK. A fantastic achievement from our pupils for displaying areas of excellence in the classroom, around school or for producing excellent homework.

Last Tuesday I invited four school inspectors into school to work with us to develop our plans for further school improvement and to provide their thoughts, observations and feedback about Broughton High School. It was pleasing to hear a number of very positive comments for example 'Behaviour around the school is impeccable and all pupils look smart in their uniform'. The experience has also provided some excellent suggestions for further development on our journey to continue to be a successful school in all areas.

On Monday we also commissioned a whole school 'Safeguarding Audit' through Lancashire County Council to quality assure our procedures in school to keep children safe. The feedback from the safeguarding advisor was extremely positive and provided external verification to reinforce our views that we do everything possible to keep our pupils safe every day at Broughton High School.

Thank you to the large number of parents who completed our annual parental survey over the last few weeks. The feedback was overwhelmingly positive but it has also given us some ideas as to how we can improve further some areas of Broughton High School. I will write to you after half term with the feedback you have provided and the suggestions for further development.

School will close at 3pm on Friday 22nd October for Half Term and re open on Monday 1st November at 8.40am. Thank you for all your wonderful support this half term. I hope you and your family have a happy and restful half term break.




