Dear Parent/Guardian,

I am speaking to all pupils this week in assemblies about the theme of Remembrance. This is an important part of our calendar that gives us time to stop and reflect on those who have made sacrifices or who have been affected by war or conflict. I will be asking the pupils in each Year Group to stop and reflect and remember those who look after them or care for them on a daily basis. I will also explain to pupils that 'remembrance' reminds us of the ongoing confrontations, hostilities and tensions that still occur daily around the world and the importance of the need for us all to work together in school, to promote harmony amongst friendship groups and to speak positively and kindly to one another. On Thursday, we will have two minutes of silence at 11am to commemorate Remembrance Day followed by pupils and staff playing 'The Last Post'. Shortly afterwards I will be joined by our Head Boy and Head Girl and their Deputies and we will lay a wreath on behalf of the school at the Broughton memorial.

As we continue on our journey towards the Lancashire Equality Mark, I will be reminding all pupils of our zero tolerance of any form of discriminatory or abusive language, any form of sexual harassment or online bullying and that we should all expect to be spoken to in a way that we would want to be spoken to ourselves. Incidents of this nature are extremely rare at Broughton, but I want to reassure you as parents that we will never tolerate any inappropriate language, comments, behaviour and aggression. Pupils are always encouraged to let us know if they have an issue and can do so by either speaking to a member of staff or emailing us using the [safe@broughton](mailto:safe@broughton) link on the school website and Firefly. If you ever have any concerns please contact us at school and we will always respond swiftly.

We will be launching three 'Pupil Voice' groups over the next two weeks that will be led and managed by our Year 10 pupils alongside a member of staff. The groups are:

1. Mental Health and Wellbeing
2. Equality and Diversity
3. Community and Charity

The purpose of these groups is to create working groups where our aim is to improve opportunities, raise awareness and listen to the needs of our pupils. Each group will have a staff member who will lead/champion each team. I will keep you updated as the groups develop and keep you informed of the new activities and the impact of their work.

This week we will be holding our Annual Awards Evening. Our former Year 11 pupils will be returning to school with their families to receive their GCSE certificates, subject prizes and special awards. We will be joined by Mr Morris who will address the pupils and present prizes and Michael Finnigan who wrote the book 'They Did, You Can' which was given to every pupil as they left us in June. I am sure it will be a wonderful evening.

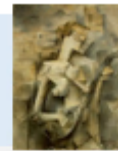

#### NOVEMBER – 1 : NAME THE 20TH CENTURY ART MOVEMENTS FOR EACH OF THE FOLLOWING PICTURES

##### 1. Cubism

An early 20th-century movement in art, in which subjects are viewed from multiple viewpoints and broken into simple geometric shapes.

Leading Artist: Pablo Picasso.



##### 2. Surrealism

A 20th-century movement in art which sought to release the creative potential of the unconscious mind; depicted dream-like & strange subject matter.

Leading artist: Salvador Dali



##### 3. Fauvism

A style of painting with vivid and non-naturalistic use of colour that started in Paris around 1905.

Leading Artist: Henri Matisse



##### 4. Pop Art

Art movement which began in late 1950s in both UK & USA. Subject matter reflected modern popular culture and the mass media.

Leading Artist: Andy Warhol



##### 5. Futurism

An artistic movement originating in Italy in 1909. It emphasized speed, technology, youth, violence and objects such as the car, the aeroplane and the industrial city. Leading artist: Giacomo Balla



##### 6. Abstract Expressionism

A development of abstract art which began in New York in the 1940s with a particular emphasis on the spontaneous, emotional & creative act of painting (also known as action painting).

Leading artist: Jackson Pollock.



##### 7. Photorealism

A style of art in the late 1960s/early 1970s, characterized by the highly detailed depiction of ordinary life with the precision of a photograph. Leading Artist: Audrey Flack



##### 8. Expressionism

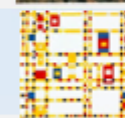
A style of painting in which the artist seeks to express the inner world of emotion rather than external reality.

Leading Artist: Edvard Munch.



##### 9. De Stijl

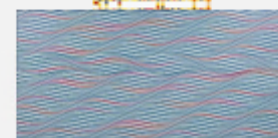
An early 20<sup>th</sup> century style of abstract painting developed by Piet Mondrian, using only vertical and horizontal lines and rectangular shapes in black, white, grey, and primary colours.



##### 10. Op Art

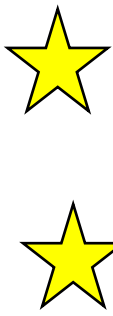
A form of abstract art developed in the 1960s, that gives the illusion of movement by the precise use of pattern and colour, or in which conflicting patterns emerge and overlap.

Leading Artist: Bridget Riley



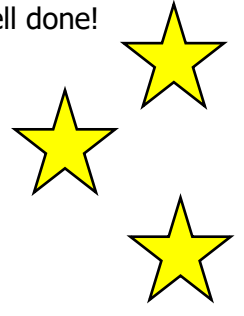

## Year 9 Boys' Football - Match Report - Broughton v Archbishop Temple

The Year 9 Boys Football Team returned from the half term break full of optimism, knowing this fixture against Archbishop Temple would be the last match until after Christmas – all players were determined to finish on a high note!

For the first time this season, Broughton were the fastest starters and this was rewarded with an early corner, taken by Dougie Harmer. The ball was delivered into the perfect area between goalkeeper and attacker, and Antonio-Raul Iglesias-Leeming was the first to meet it. His initial header was saved, but after some determined tackling, the ball ended up in the back of the net; 1-0.

As with other results this season, Broughton knew that they needed to keep this pressure up and did just that with some fantastic passing play, but with no tangible reward... until Bobby Shorrock decided to take matters into his own hands. Picking up the ball from a deeper position compared to his usual striker role, he decided to take a shot from around 35 yards out – and what a decision it was, wrongfooting the goalkeeper and putting Broughton 2-0 ahead at half time.

After a positive half time team talk, Broughton stepped up into top gear and began extending their advantage. Bobby Shorrock added his second goal after some good play from the Broughton midfield, followed by a Tom Sharky goal which matched Bobby's first effort in terms of distance and technique – whatever Bobby could do, Tom certainly matched it! Finally, after some rotational changes, a new look Broughton midfield worked the ball well around Archbishop's penalty area, resulting in Jacob Barker putting the icing on Broughton's end of season cake with a neat finish – final score, Broughton High School 5-0 Archbishop Temple.

The Preston Schools' Cup fixtures after Christmas can't come soon enough for this Year 9 group, with the prospect of playing at Deepdale Stadium providing the inspiration to go as far as possible in this cup competition!

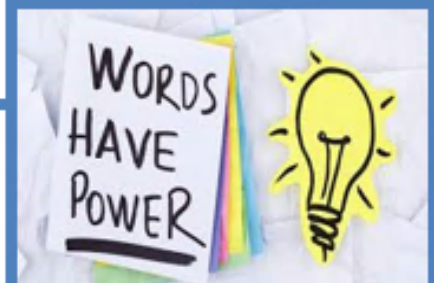

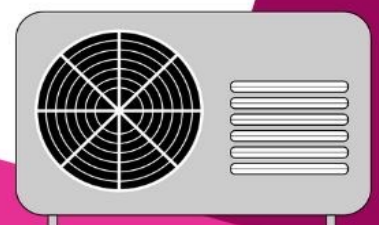

Homework Task: Design and Make a Seasonal Vegetarian Dish. Date: 30/10/21

**Recipe**

**Vegetarian Lasagne**

**Method**

1. Chop all the vegetables.
2. Heat the oil in the pan and fry the onion and garlic for 5 minutes. Then add the other vegetables and fry for 2 minutes. Next add the tomato puree and the tomatoes and boil.
3. Melt the margarine and stir in the flour. Add the milk and stir till it thickens.
4. Place in the lasagne sheets sauce and vegetables and repeat. Grate the cheese on the top.
5. Put in oven at 180c for 35 minutes. Then serve.

### Joseph's Vegan Chilli

**Ingredients**

- 300g dried urid beans
- 200g dried kidney beans
- 1 whole onion
- 2 cloves of garlic
- 2tbsp of olive or vegetable oil
- 2tsp of paprika
- 2tsp of cumin
- 1tsp of mixed herbs
- 2 carrots
- 3 sticks of celery
- 30 small tomatoes
- 100g tomato puree
- A pinch of salt and pepper
- One tin of red kidney beans
- One green pepper

**Method**

1. Leave the beans to soak in cold water for 24 hours.
2. Dice the onion and garlic and put it in a pan with the oil, cumin paprika and mixed herbs and fry until the onions are soft, stirring occasionally.
3. Dice the carrots and celery and add the whole tomatoes and add them all into the slow cooker.
4. Rinse your beans in cold water and add them along with the onion spice mix and add enough water to just cover the beans into the slow cooker season with salt and pepper and add some tomato puree.
5. Turn on the slow cooker to medium and leave for approximately 4 hours before adding the soft veg.
6. An hour before you want to eat it, add the tin of beans and a chopped green pepper.
7. Serve with rice, nachos or in wraps.

### Samuel's Pumpkin Hummus

Homework: Pumpkin Hummus. 31/10/21

**Recipe:**

- 500g pumpkin
- Olive oil for roasting
- 2 garlic cloves (peeled)
- Juice of half a lemon
- 2 tbsp of tahini paste
- 100g of drained chickpeas
- 1 red and yellow pepper (deseeded and sliced)
- Multi-grain thins

**Method:**

- Step 1:**
  - Cut the top off the pumpkin
  - Scoop out the seeds
  - Remove the fleshy part from the bottom and the lid of the pumpkin
- Step 2:**
  - Heat the oven to 200°C/390°F
  - Cut the pumpkin's flesh into pieces and add the garlic cloves
  - Put them into a baking tray and add olive oil. Don't forget the seasoning
  - Bake for 45 minutes or until the pumpkin is tender
  - Take time to cool
- Step 3:**
  - Add the pumpkin, garlic, lemon juice, tahini paste and chickpeas in a food processor or use a hand blender
  - Season and blend until the mixture looks like a paste
  - Drained and stir-puree red and yellow peppers
  - Season the hummus with the peppers and the multi-grain thins

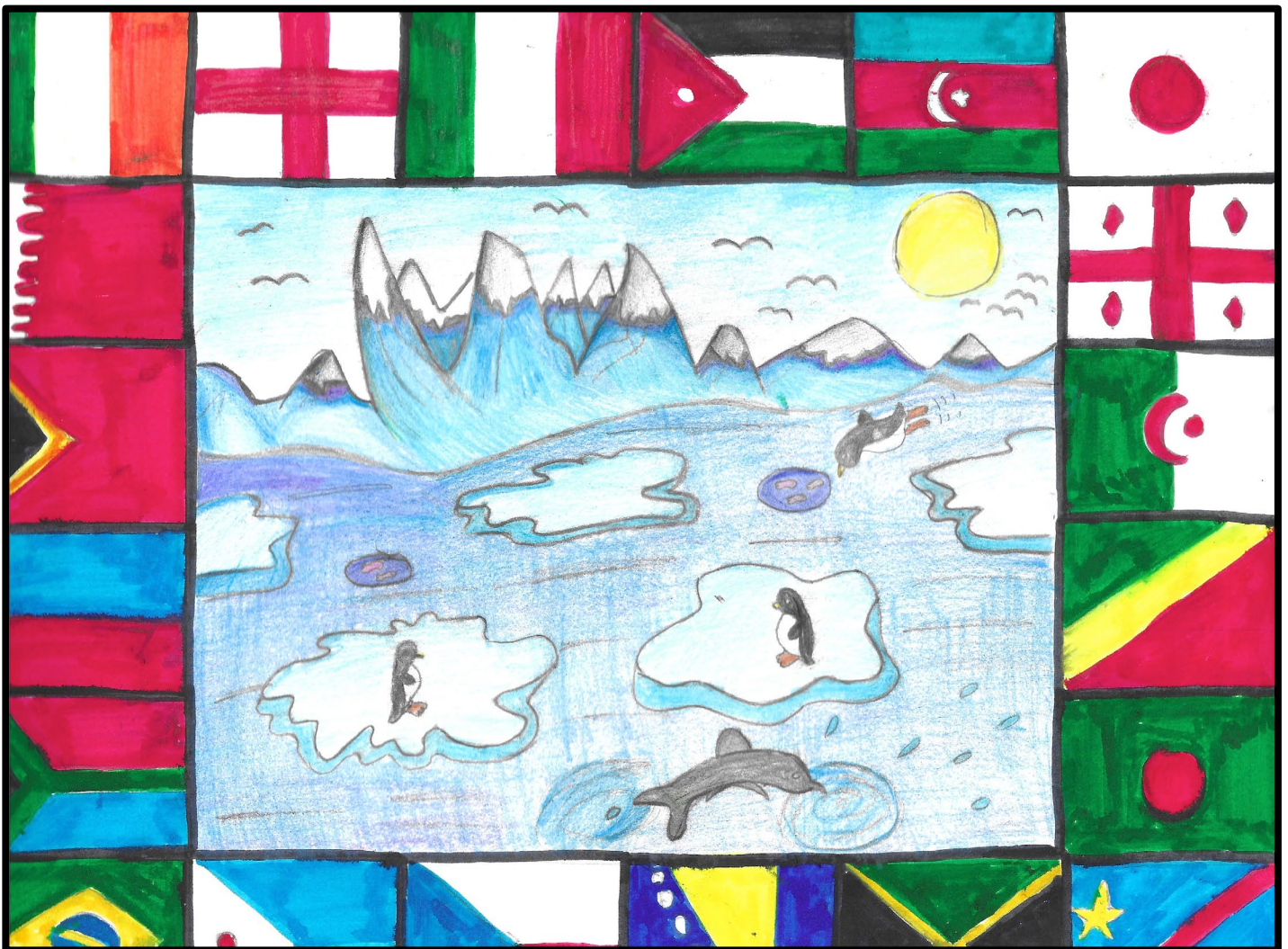

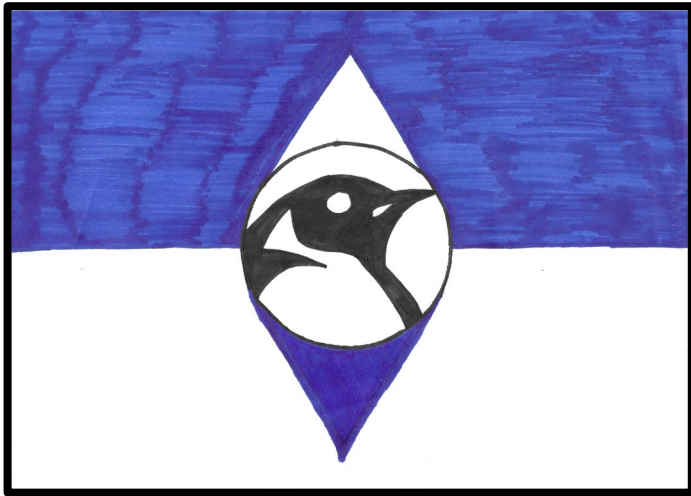
# The Antarctica Day Flags Initiative

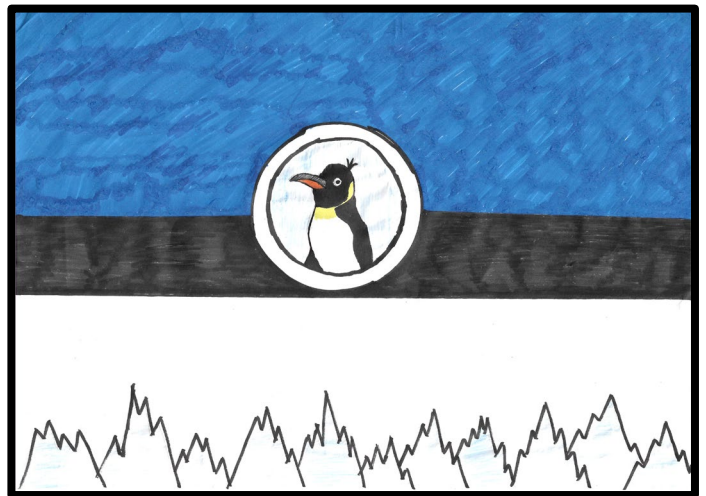
