Dear Parent/Guardian,

Today we shared the Year 11 Mock Exam grades with the pupils which has given them an indication of their progress so far and grades from their performance in the mock exam period. This event is organised to replicate the examination results day in August and will give the Year 11 pupils a taste of what this day will feel like in the summer. I am pleased to say that the huge majority of pupils performed exceptionally well in their mock exams that were taken in December and so many of them received grades that they were extremely happy with. Well done to all pupils in Year 11 for their results so far. I am confident that you will all go from strength to strength over the next few months. I know our pupils will be well prepared and highly motivated to give their best to their revision over the next few months prior to sitting their exams.

On the 16th March we will be holding the Year 11 Parents' Evening where pupils and parents will be able to discuss progress made since the mocks and the information from the 2nd review of the year. Throughout this evening there will be multiple opportunities to attend the 'Help your Child Revise Session' in the Junior Dining room which will give parents some invaluable tips on how to support your child with their revision over the coming months. You will also be able to collect your child's personal revision plan which will be available on the night. We strongly encourage all pupils to attend with their parents on this evening.

This weekend sees the start of the Duke of Edinburgh practice expeditions with over 30 of our Year 10 pupils navigating their way cross country from school to the Plough at Eaves. The four groups will be chaperoned by Mr Lowe, Miss Klunder, Mr Ellis, Miss Belcher, Mrs Ellis, Mr Shepherd and Mr Hughes. They will all hope to navigate their way successfully and arrive safe and sound across some very muddy fields after their two-hour expedition. We have another group next weekend who will be completing their practice expedition also. Thank you to the members of staff for giving their time, not only on Saturday morning but through the whole Duke of Edinburgh course.

School sport continues to thrive with football, basketball, table tennis, dance, chess, running club, American Football and a number of other sports clubs all flourishing this week. Please encourage your child to get involved wherever possible with our extra-curricular provision at lunch time and after school. Many thanks to our PTFA who have purchased four outdoor table tennis tables for our pupils to use at break and lunchtimes. These will be available to use after the February half term break and will be a real addition to break and lunchtime routines. Congratulations to Hugh Smith and Lewis Nelson in Year 8 who have recently competed in the Lancashire Cross Country Championship at Witton Park. Hugh came 5th overall and has now been selected to represent Lancashire at Loughborough on the 11th March. Lewis came 10th and narrowly missed out on a place in the Lancashire squad. Well done to both boys who ran really well in very cold, wet and muddy conditions.

Please can I remind all parents about the importance of attendance at school. Our school attendance figures are always impressive but there is a direct link between intermittent attendance and exam performance. The school day starts at 8.40am. Any pupils arriving after this time will receive a break time detention.

I do not authorise absence for holidays in school time. If a pupil is absent for holidays, this will result in an unauthorised absence on their school record. If you are in any doubt about holiday dates, please refer to the school website before you book, or simply ring school. The holiday pattern does change from year to year, so it is always worth checking. The holiday pattern for this academic year is attached to this newsletter. You may notice an additional holiday has been added on Monday 8th May 2023; this day will be a Bank Holiday across the UK. The national holiday will mark the King's coronation, which will take place on Saturday 6th May 2023.

Traffic, parking and dropping off and picking up children at Broughton High School continues to be an issue and is causing some genuine problems for residents and other road users at the start and the end of the day. Please can I remind you to be considerate to each other and our local residents at both points before and after school. It is critical that we work together to alleviate parking around the A6, Sandy Gate Lane, Northway and along Woodplumpton Road and that if you are dropping your child off or collecting them after school you are considerate of other road users at all times. 

In the first carousel pupils were given an inspiring presentation by Anthony (Nurse) and Kate (Airline Pilot). They talked about their career path and current job role. Pupils were clearly engaged and inspired by their presentations.







The second carousel was delivered by Sarah from Amazing Apprenticeships. Pupils were provided information about the range of apprenticeships at 16, 18 and beyond. Sarah provided tips on searching for apprenticeships and the application process. Pupils attended a workshop run by Zac and his colleagues from Career North who probed our Y10 pupils into thinking about their interests, passions and next steps. Pupils completed an information gather which will be used to help Career North provide the cohort with independent and expert career advice over the coming year.



All pupils can book a careers appointment at any time by requesting an appointment with Mrs Dumbell in pupil reception. Parents are also welcome to attend appointments should they wish.

In the final carousel, Y10 pupils were introduced work experience. The three-day work experience is scheduled for 11th-13th July 2023. HOW TO BECOME A DOCTOR



This is a reminder that all aspiring doctors in years 10--11 are eligible to join our free 6 month work experience programme.
