Dear Parent/Guardian,

Since we returned to school in September we have managed to return to the normality of offering a wide variety of trips for our pupils. These trips provide valuable learning experiences outside of the classroom and allow great opportunities for the development of cultural experiences. I am sure you will agree, a wide and varied range of extra-curricular opportunities.

This week saw a group of 44 pupils and staff depart for their visit to Berlin. For a number of our pupils it was the first time they had been abroad without their families and there was definitely a feeling of excitement and nervousness as the pupils gathered to board the coaches on Wednesday morning. The itinerary was packed full of exciting opportunities for the duration of the trip but I wanted to share an extract from Thursday's schedule:

'Really early starts at 6:30 this morning. Our first excursion of the morning took us to the TV tower, the tallest building in Germany. A language trail challenged all the pupils in teams to explore and collect answers to a variety of local landmarks, writing their answers in German. The winning team being awarded a prize by our language guide who said our pupils completed the task in record time and scored the highest scores. After this we sampled a traditional food market, tasting many local dishes including Currywurst, Quarkkeulchen and falafel bites. After lunch we made our way to the museum island enjoying the sunshine and views of the Berliner Dom and Berlin Schloss and History Museum. Our final excursion for today we visited the amazing Deutsche Technik Museum, this gave a fascinating insight into ancient and modern technologies including developments in flight, sailing, steam power and the textiles industry. An evening meal and 44 tired explorers are all looking forward to another great day tomorrow.'

What an amazing experience for our pupils. Thank you to the staff who have organised and accompanied this trip.

On Tuesday we held our first Year 8 PTFA Family Bingo evening. With well over 100 pupils and family members in school it was a great opportunity to meet socially and play a few games of bingo, whilst raising money for pupils at school.

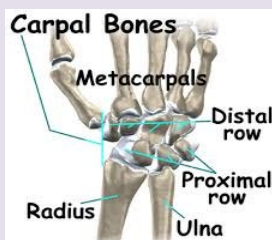

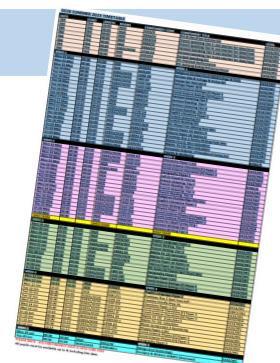

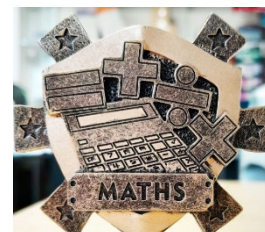
Runshaw College Maths Challenge

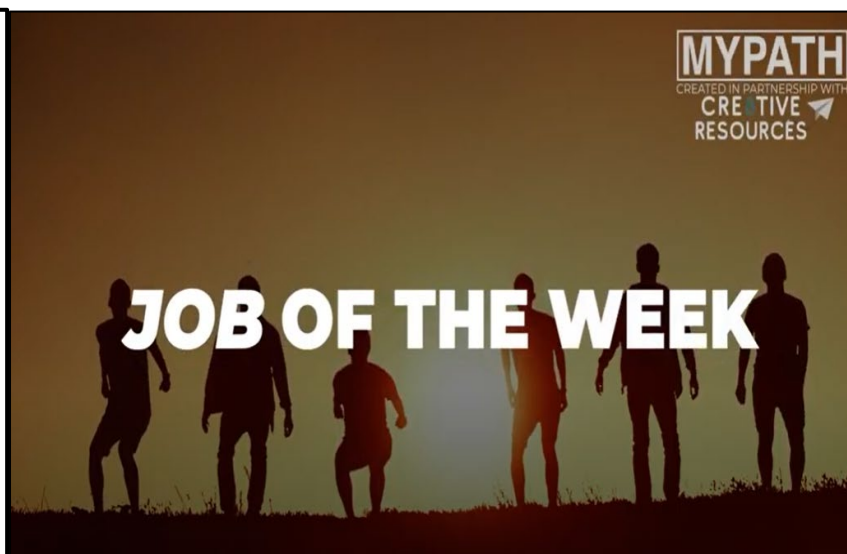
