Dear Parent/Guardian,

As we draw to the end of the Spring Term it is important to reflect on the hard work and effort that so many of our pupils demonstrate on a daily basis here at Broughton High School. Whether it is their passion to want to give their best academically in the classroom or through homework or revision, to show off one of their amazing talents on the sports field, in the drama studio, in music or at one of our many extra-curricular clubs or simply to show kindness, manners or support for their fellow pupils and members of staff, our pupils never fail to amaze me with their high expectations of themselves and their ambition to be the best version of themselves. I hope all the pupils have a wonderful Easter break and an opportunity to relax and rest away from school.

It was wonderful to welcome Year 9 pupils and parents last night to our Parents' Evening and Options Evening. There was a really good atmosphere around school as teachers enjoyed giving some feedback to pupils and parents and advice regarding potential option choices over the next few weeks. The extremely informative options talk, led by Mr Church, allowed pupils an opportunity to fine tune their thinking on the choices of subjects to study as they progress into Years 10 and 11. With 91% attendance on the evening it was an extremely impressive turnout. Thank you to all parents who attended and for the overwhelmingly positive feedback received from the parental questionnaire.

Over the last week, pupils in Years 7, 8 and 9 have been issued with their 'Review 2' information highlighting progress against their last report. I am really pleased to see such a huge number of pupils making excellent progress since their last review showing that they had taken on board the feedback from teachers and acted upon it. Please take a few moments to talk through the review information with your child when you get chance. Year 10 reviews will be given out to pupils on Monday 17<sup>th</sup> April in advance of the Year 10 Parents' Evening on Thursday 20<sup>th</sup> April, starting at 4pm.

This morning we waved goodbye to 39 pupils and 5 staff who were setting off for the first ski trip since the pandemic. Mr Bailey and his team have meticulously planned an extremely exciting visit to Zell Am See in Austria. I know they will have an amazing time and look forward to hearing all about the trip on their return.

Congratulations to Humaira Yasmin, Muhammad Dola, Fatimah Adam and Ariana Ehsan who spoke superbly last week in all our assemblies with Mrs Harris delivering our assemblies about Ramadan. They all spoke exceptionally well and with real confidence to each year group.

This term we have been raising money for a local charity called 'Jade's Bag'. This charity aims to serve the people of Preston who are having an extremely difficult time. This could range from victims of domestic violence, the homeless or those who have just given birth. As I mentioned in an earlier newsletter, over Christmas they supported 20 families by providing them with Christmas lunches. This charity has an impact directly on the people of Preston and is a worthy cause for our fundraising efforts this term. I know the pupils have worked hard to achieve as many reward points as possible to support this charity and have managed to raise just over £500. We will be presenting this amount to the charity when we return after the Easter break. Well done to all pupils.

It is also impressive to see so many children working towards their 'Best of Broughton Award'. This is an award that aims to develop pupil character and the pupils will work on this throughout the year with the aim of completing all aspects of the challenge.

To achieve this award pupils will need to complete all eight challenges below.

- 1. Achieve at least a bronze award for academic and pastoral achievement in school.
- 2. Have great attendance: This must be across a term.
- 3. Evidence of reading at least 3 extra-curricular books.
- 4. Support a parents' evening, open night or event that shows willingness and commitment.
- 5. Attend a club or team activity over a minimum of 4 sessions.
- 6. Support a charity by promoting or helping raise funds.
- 7. Help out in a chosen area of school in the pupil's own time.
- 8. Feature in the school newsletter or receive a praise postcard.

Every pupil who manages to achieve this award will receive one of our new 'Best of Broughton' badges to wear on their blazer. We have a significant number of children across all year groups who have now completed this award. Congratulations to those pupils that have achieved this award already. Form tutors will be working with those pupils who haven't yet managed to complete all the tasks through the summer term.

The pupils look exceptionally smart in their uniforms and we have only had to remind a very small number of pupils about wearing their uniform correctly. Please remember that our uniform policy states that uniform should be worn correctly at all times. Ties should be knotted correctly and go to the waistband of trousers or skirts. Shirts should be tucked in at all times. Skirts should be worn correctly and at the knee. Shoes must be plain black (no trainers). Outdoor coats should be plain black or blue and must never be worn inside the school building. We do not allow coats or hooded tops with motifs or large emblems, or jewelry (apart from a single pair of plain studded earrings).

All uniform can be purchased from Monkhouse Schoolwear (Preston) or from The Uniform and Leisurewear Company (Garstang). We have an array of uniform items available for a small donation to the school's chosen charity. If we have the item in stock, you will be able to make a small donation on ParentPay and then the item will be bagged like all uniform deliveries to school and then collected in school.



# Online Safety Newsletter April 2023

### Sendit

Sendit is an add on app to Snapchat and it allows users to play games together. Sendit state on their website that the app is not intended for children under the age of 13.

The games include Q&A games including ask me anything. A user asks a question and players can respond anonymously. As with any anonymous element, there is an increased risk of cyberbullying.

The app does contain in-app purchases ranging from £0.99 to £29.99. There is also a weekly subscription service available, which provides users with enhanced features. It costs £8.49 per week. Ensure payment details are not stored/accessible on your child's device to avoid unexpected bills.

If you know that your child is using this app (and they are underage) then you can contact Sendit to ask them to disable their account.

### **Anime TV**

Anime refers to animations originating from Japan. Due to its cartoon style, your child might inadvertently watch it when it isn't appropriate for their age. Some Anime contains adult themes. It is important to check age ratings so a starting point could be Common Sense Media. They have created a list of some Anime TV with reviews/age ratings:

### **Being unkind online**

It can be very easy online for children to behave in a way that they wouldn't if they were face to face with each other.

Talk to your child about how they speak to others online and encourage them to talk to people online with respect and kindness, like they would



if they were face-to-face. How they act online should be how they behave on the school playground when they are following school rules. Here are some examples of what being unkind looks like online:

- Sending nasty or hurtful messages
- Leaving unkind comments
- Sharing photographs of somebody else without their permission
- Excluding somebody on purpose
- Impersonating somebody with a fake account
- Telling/sharing lies

The above might happen whilst your child is gaming online or whilst using social media or messaging apps e.g. WhatsApp.

### What should I do if my child is being bullied online?

Ensure that your child understands that if they receive unkind messages or see something that worries them, they should not reply or engage in conversation with the perpetrator. Instead, they should tell a trusted adult. You can use the tools within an app to report any offensive or hurtful content as well as block people so they cannot contact you again in the future.

# BeReal

You must be 13+ to use BeReal. BeReal is a social media app. It notifies you once a day to upload an image of what you are doing. Once you receive the notification, you have two minutes to capture and share what you are doing at that moment. All your friends post at the exact same time and once you have



posted, you can then see what your friends have posted. If you do not post, then you cannot see your friend's BeReals from that day or access the discovery tab.

### What do I need to be aware of?

BeReal is private by default and only visible to your friends. However, it is possible to share with all users by selecting the public option. If selected, your BeReal will appear in the Discovery tab so all users can see and interact with it, therefore there is the possibility of strangers contacting your child.

There is also an option to share your location. Chat to your child about location sharing as it is important that your child understands the risk of location sharing and when it is and is not appropriate to share.

Discovery tab – this is the area where you can view all other BeReals that have been made public. There is an element of risk that your child may see an inappropriate image depending on what others have uploaded.

If your child is using BeReal then talk to them about what they share, what they should do if they see something inappropriate or that they find upsetting and that they know how to use the reporting tools.

# Snapchat

Update

### **Family Centre: New Feature**

Snapchat launched Family Centre last year, which includes features such as allowing you to see who your child is friends with on Snapchat and who they have been communicating with (you will not be able to see the contents of conversations).

Snapchat have now announced their latest feature for Family Centre - Content Controls. Content controls will allow you to limit the type of content your child can watch on Snapchat by filtering out stories.

### TikTok update

You must be over 13 years of age to use TikTok.

**60-minute screentime notification**TikTok are introducing a 60-minute screentime notification for teen accounts (accounts with users under 18 years of age). When the time limit is reached, the user will be asked to enter their passcode to continue watching.

### **Family Pairing: new features**

This allows you to link your own account to your child's account. TikTok have now added three new features:

- Custom daily screen time limits: this option includes choosing different time limits depending on the day of the week as well.
- Screen time dashboard: this
   provides a summary of time spent
   on the app, the number of times
   TikTok was opened, and a
   breakdown of total time spent
   during the day and night.
- Mute notifications: this setting will enable you to mute notifications at set times. Accounts aged 13-15 already do not receive push notifications from 9pm and for accounts aged 16-17, notifications are disabled from 10pm.
