Dear Parent/Guardian,

This week has seen our Year 11 pupils start their long-awaited GCSE exams. They have had an extremely busy week with twenty exams being completed already across a number of subjects. The feeling from pupils and staff has been extremely positive and we are confident that the pupils have given their very best in the preparation and completion of their final exams so far. They have a busy few weeks ahead but I know they are well prepared and that they have supportive parents, teachers and friends around them for support. Good luck also to our Year 8 pupils who start their end of year assessments next week.

On Wednesday evening we saw the return of the annual Broughton High School Dance Festival. Over 50 pupils were supported by a full house of spectators and performed some amazing GCSE dance routines, street dance, gymnastics and cheerleading. The pupils performing were unbelievably confident and had obviously spent hours of dedication perfecting their routines. The standard of performances from both individuals and groups was of an exceptionally high standard. Most importantly, however, was that the pupils were having an amazing time and enjoying themselves whilst performing with their friends and classmates. Thank you to all parents and families who supported the evening and special thanks to Mrs Hough who spent a huge amount of time practicing with the children and coordinating the whole evening.

Congratulations to our U14 Girls' Football Team who beat Southlands last night 4-0 in the semi-final of the Lancashire Cup. Mrs Rukin said that the team played extremely well and fully deserved their place in the final. To get to a Lancashire Cup final is an unbelievable achievement and I want to congratulate the whole team on their efforts: Alex Latham, Evie Lee, Lily Beetham, Olivia Rankin, Olivia Newman-Kirk, Amy Beardwood, Kara Lee, Imogen Goodwin, Amara Jenkins Smith, May Ackley, Isabelle Harrop and Tabitha Lamoury. The final will be played next Tuesday evening, 23rd May, at Darwen FC Football Club, with a 5.30pm kick off.

Deputy Police and Crime Commissioner Andy Pratt MBE, and officers from Lancashire Police, have worked with pupils and teachers this week to talk about road safety. With support from officers, pupils got to try out speed guns to check the speed of drivers passing the school and also spotted other traffic offences such as drivers not wearing seatbelts or parking dangerously. During the visit, which was also attended by a member of the local parish council, pupils learned about the most dangerous traffic offences which make drivers far more likely to be involved in potentially fatal collisions known as the Fatal Five. These include careless driving, drink and drug driving, not wearing a seatbelt, using a mobile phone and speeding. Deputy PCC Andy Pratt said: "Targeting dangerous drivers is a priority in the Police and Crime Plan for Lancashire and, as chair of Lancashire's Road Safety Partnership, this work is really important to me. Most accidents on our roads can easily be avoided and education has a key role to play in road safety and accident prevention. All the pupils I met as part of this visit are a real credit to Broughton High School, coming up with their own ideas to prevent accidents and getting involved tackling dangerous driving around the school.

After consultation with pupils, from September 2023 there is going to be an update to both the boys and girls PE kit. The kit is being updated to a more modern, lightweight and breathable material, with the aim of it being more comfortable for pupils to wear. The most notable difference is the move away from skorts for girls, to female fit shorts. The socks and swackets will stay the same for both boys and girls. The new kit will be compulsory for the new Year 7 intake, but is completely optional for current Years 7-10. However, moving forward, if a pupil loses an item of kit, they will have to replace it with the updated PE kit as the old stock will soon run out. If a pupil would like to purchase just one or two items of the new kit, for example the girls' shorts, and combine it with their old kit this is absolutely fine. I am also pleased to tell you that the new t-shirts and shorts for both boys and girls are cheaper than the old kit, so should your child want or need to replace any items it will save you a few pounds! 



U14 Girls' Football



On Wednesday 17th May, the girls' U14 football team played in the semi-final of the Lancashire Cup away at Southlands in Chorley. Broughton tested the keeper almost immediately from the whistle, with **May Ackley** unlucky not to find the back of the net. Southlands responded by creating a chance at the other end, but it wasn't good enough to beat the excellent **Evie Lee** in goal.

Broughton went on to dominate the first half and deservedly went 1-0 up in the 23rd minute, when **May Ackley** found **Izzy Harrop**, who slotted it past the keeper. Broughton created lots more chances and were unlucky not to be more than 1-0 up at half time, but it was immediately after the restart that **Izzy Harrop** once again found the back of the net to make it 2-0.

A solid defensive display from Olivia Rankin, Alex Latham, Lily Beetham, Amy Beardwood, and Tabitha Lamoury meant any opportunities for Southlands to attack were quickly and calmly dealt with. Imogen Goodwin, Kara Lee and Olivia Newman-Kirk dominated in midfield and Imogen Goodwin got two assists with a fantastic through ball to May Ackley, and then again to Amara Jenkins Smith to finish the game 4-0 and send the girls into the Lancashire Cup final.

This is the third Lancashire Cup final in two years that Broughton girls have reached, with the Year 7s winning the Lancashire Cup last year and the U16s suffering a narrow defeat. Broughton are a dominant force across Lancashire and should be extremely proud of their efforts.

It's time to celebrate all our favourite reads this year in the library by holding our annual Book Battle.


32 competitors have been selected from amongst the most borrowed titles in the library and will compete in a series of knock out battles to be crowned:

Votes can be registered electronically by logging onto Firefly-Resources-LRC-Battle of the Books 2023. There




