Dear Parent/Guardian,

As I am sure you are all aware the school received its first OFSTED inspection since 2012 this week. We were visited by a team of 4 inspectors who spent a significant amount of time visiting lessons, speaking to members of staff and pupils and meeting our governing body. Please can I say a huge thank you to all the parents and pupils who were able to complete the questionnaires that were sent out. I know the inspectors found your views extremely valuable and informative. A significant number of our pupils were spoken to over the course of the inspections and I was extremely proud of their confidence, their honesty and their passion about attending Broughton High School. We are not allowed to share any details of the inspection outcome yet, as it now has a quality assurance process to go through, but please be reassured that as soon as I am able to share this information you will be the first to know.

What continues to impress me as the Headteacher here at Broughton High School is the significant amount of clubs and activities that our pupils are able to 'get involved' with, that add to the wider school curriculum offer and give them different opportunities to grow, develop and learn. This week alone there have been over 50 different clubs that are available for every pupil to attend. Please continue to encourage your child to attend these activities wherever possible. A great example this week was the cross-country club where over 40 pupils attended to test themselves against the clock on our school cross country course. Great effort!

On Monday, we held our annual 'Open Day' where we welcomed a significant number of prospective pupils and parents to look around our school on a 'normal' school day. Families were shown around school by our team of expert prefects and were able to visit lessons and speak to current pupils and teachers. The feedback from our visitors was extremely positive.

The theme for this week's assemblies has been around ensuring we never tolerate bullying, keeping everyone safe in school and where to go for help if pupils are ever worried. We reminded pupils that reporting incidents of bullying is an act of "heroism". We talked to pupils about how we investigate bullying and that at Broughton we have a zero tolerance. We also reminded pupils where to go for help if they are feeling low or struggling with their mental health. We explained that there are services, places and people to talk to both in and outside of school who can help. Finally we reminded pupils that it is "good to talk" and to 'never suffer in silence' and that we have safe@broughton for pupils to securely share any concerns they may have. Our school website has also lots of good advice of where to go for help.

Our reading curriculum is a real strength here at Broughton and it continues to be an extremely important part of every child's development. We will be continuing a whole school drive to encourage and improve reading here at Broughton and would strongly encourage you to help your son/daughter to read as often and as widely as possible. If you have noticed that reading at home is not as popular as it once was, here are a few ideas to get your child reading again:

- Keep reading material all over the house.
- Model reading. If your son/daughter sees you reading, conversation naturally follows.
- Graphic novels (comics) are now recognised as literature; they may be the key to getting your teenager hooked on books.

- Merge movies with books. Offer your son or daughter the print version to read before a big film adaptation comes out on film.
- Buy them a book as a present. Any number of websites recommend books for teenagers.
- Ask your son/daughter to tell you something (characters/plot/twist) about the book they are currently reading.

Any additional reading at home will definitely complement the work done in school.

Pupil homework timetables are now on the school website. Please ask to see your child's pupil planner to monitor homework that is set. If you have any concerns regarding homework please contact your son/daughter's Head of Year.

If your child cycles to school please can you remind them that a fastened helmet must be worn at all times for the whole of the duration to and from school. As the mornings and evenings get darker it is also advised to purchase lights for your child's bike to make them more visible to drivers and pedestrians. Please also remind your child to cycle safely at all times, not only for themselves but for other cyclists, pedestrians and motorists.

Thank you so much for your continued support. Our school's success is built on a close partnership between home and school and your support is very much appreciated and never taken for granted. It really is a privilege to be the Headteacher of such a wonderful school.


If your child is unable to attend school for any reason, for safeguarding purposes, it is imperative that you phone school or email before 8.30am to inform us.

## **Snapchat Update**

## What is Snapchat?

Snapchat is an app used for messaging and sharing photos and videos. You must be 13+ to sign up. Users can send messages (snaps) to



others that can only be seen for a set time period e.g. 10 seconds. Users can also upload snaps to stories which then disappear after 24 hours.

## **Snapchat Family Centre – NEW**

Snapchat have introduced a new in-app tool called Family Centre. Family Centre will allow you to see who your child is friends with on Snapchat and who they have been communicating with (you will not be able to see the contents of conversations). You will also be able to see who they are friends with on Snapchat, report accounts confidentially and view resources to help you start conversations with your child about online safety.

## Safety tips

It is important to talk to your child regularly about what they are doing online and make sure that they know that they should always talk to you or another trusted adult if they have any concerns. Please make sure the appropriate privacy settings are set up on Snapchat and your child knows how to block and report other users if necessary.

We would recommend you explore Snapchat with your child and suggest why certain options are safer, for example, setting your account so only friends (rather than everyone) can see your content and only those you are friends with can contact you.

## BeReal

## What is BeReal?

BeReal is a new social media app. It notifies you once a day to upload an image of what you are doing. Once you receive the notification, you have two mins to capture and share what you are doing at that moment. All your friends post at the exact



same time. Once you have posted, you can then see what your friends have posted. If you don't post your BeReal, then you can't see your friend's BeReals from that day or access the discovery tab.

## What age should I be?

You must be 13+ to use BeReal. BeReal is rated as 12+ by the App store and rated for Teens on Google Play. Users add their date of birth to register (no age verification takes place) although users do need to add a mobile number.

## What else do I need to be aware of?

BeReal is private by default and only visible to your friends. However, it is possible to share with all users by selecting the public option. If selected, your BeReal will appear in the Discovery tab for all users to see and interact with.

There is also an option to share your location. If you don't enable your location, then you can't see other user's locations. Chat to your child about location sharing as it is important that your child understands the risk of location sharing and when it may be appropriate to share.

Discovery tab — this is the area where you can view all other BeReals that have been made public (if you have posted that day). There is an element of risk that your child may see an inappropriate image depending on what others have uploaded.

## How to report

You can report a BeReal or a user by clicking on the three dots (next to the BeReal or user) to report. You can then choose whether you think the BeReal is undesirable or if it is inappropriate. You can block users on Android but not on iOS (BeReal have said this functionality will be available soon). People you have accepted as 'friends' can be deleted at any time.

If your child is using BeReal then talk to them about what they are sharing on BeReal and check that they know how to use the reporting tools available.
