Dear Parent/Guardian,

It has been an extremely hot week in school due to the recent spell of warm weather but I have been really impressed with the way the staff and pupils have coped in lessons and around the school site. We have made some amendments to the wearing of school uniform throughout the day and pupils have been able to replenish their water bottles when needed to keep them hydrated. Pupils must always start the day wearing full school uniform and on hot days we will always inform them by 8.50am that they can remove their ties and blazers for the remainder of the day.

I am pleased to announce that we are again heavily oversubscribed for next year and that we are looking forward to welcoming our new pupils and families to Broughton High School at the 'New Year 7 Induction Day and Evening' in a few weeks' time. New pupils will spend a day with us in school and then their parents will return in the evening to meet members of the Senior Leadership Team, Head of Year and their individual Form Tutors. We look forward to seeing our new pupils and their families on the 3rd July.

This week we have had two very important events in school for pupils in Year 7 and 8. On Thursday, Year 7 experienced a 'Learn to Earn' morning organised by Mr Lord, Head of Careers. This involved pupils outlining their lifestyle aspirations and which career path can facilitate their ambitions using up-to-date labour market information. Needless to say, there were one or two confrontations with reality as they encountered true salaries, income tax and national insurance deductions! The guest speakers were extremely impressed by the behaviour and application of Year 7, they represented the school wonderfully.

Year 8 had a superb morning on Friday, when they focused on personal development and were spoken to by a number of outside speakers. Year 8 pupils experienced a range of activities focused on the theme of celebrating diversity. These included learning a new language (Swedish!), inclusive sports, Indian drumming, Bollywood Dancing, textile crafting and an introduction to the Equality leaders initiative that will be fully launched in September. The pupils all responded superbly, fully engaging in the activities and impeccably behaved.

I would like to take this opportunity to remind parents about the extensive amount of information on our school website regarding our curriculum in each subject and year group. This information highlights the full year curriculum and what pupils will be taught and when. We have developed this in detail over the last two years and if you ever require any curriculum content information for any subject you can find this under the 'Curriculum' tab on the homepage. As mentioned in an earlier newsletter, from September 2023 there is going to be an update to the Broughton PE kit. The new kit will be compulsory for the new Year 7 intake, but is completely optional for current Years 7-10. However, moving forward, if a pupil loses an item of kit, they will have to replace it with the updated PE kit as the old stock will soon run out. If a pupil would like to purchase just one or two items of the new kit, for example the shorts, and combine it with their old kit this is absolutely fine. I am also pleased to tell you that the new t-shirts and shorts are cheaper than the old kit, so should your child want or need to replace any items it will save you a few pounds!

One of the many comments made by all the inspectors during our Ofsted inspection in September was about how impressive our school uniform was and how smart all the pupils look on their way to and from school and during the school day. Thank you for your ongoing support in ensuring that uniform is worn correctly at all times and that no make-up or false tan is worn in school. We will be holding our first Sports Day for a number of years on Monday 17th July. This will be a whole school event with the throwing and jumping events being held at the start of the day and the track events for the majority of the afternoon. We always encourage everyone to get involved with this day whether as a competitor, organiser or spectator. If the weather is a problem on that day, we will move the day to Tuesday 18th July. If we are experiencing hot weather we will ask pupils to wear caps or sun hats, bring their own sun cream and wear sunglasses if necessary. There will be plenty of refreshments available for pupils throughout the afternoon.

Congratulations to a number of our pupils in Year 7 and 8 who represent our school in the Preston City representative team. They battled their way through to the Lancashire Cup Final and won 4-0 against the Chorley schools' representative side. Congratulations to Amara Jenkins, Lily Beetham, Kara Lee, Imogen Goodwin, Ellie O'Neill, Amy Beardwood, and Grace Lochhead. A huge congratulations also goes to pupils from Year 9 and Year 10 in the school Rounders team who have become Preston Champions. Well done to all the pupils who took part. 
