Dear Parent/Guardian,

Since I wrote to you in my last newsletter we have filled the last seven days with an unbelievable amount of activities ranging from the Year 11 Leavers' Prom to the summer music concert, Science Trip to London, D of E Expedition and an array of sporting fixtures, all in addition to the usual day to day lessons and lunch time activities and after school clubs.

This year we were treated to a range of both vocal and instrumental pieces, from first time performances to the more experienced Broughton School Jazz Band. Thank you to all the pupils who took part and to Mr Shepherd and Miss Peters and the supporting additional musicians.

The Science department have taken 40 Year 8 pupils to visit London this week as part of our annual Science Trip. On Thursday the pupils visited the Science Museum and had a wonderful afternoon exploring some of the amazing exhibitions and the iMax cinema. The evening itinerary included an excellent restaurant meal and a trip to see the hit musical 'Wicked'. Today pupils had an early start and visited the Natural History Museum. I am sure both staff and pupils have had an amazing experience outside of the classroom and thanks to the Science staff who have organised and supervised this trip.

As mentioned in last week's newsletter, the NEU teaching union will be taking industrial action on Wednesday and Friday next week. Our aim is to continue to keep school open for all year groups and to continue with the planned end of year rewards trips to Blackpool Zoo and Blackpoll Pleasure Beach. 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

Quora

Quora should only be accessed by users that are 13+. Quora is a question-and-answer site. You do need to set up an account to see and post replies.

Due to the nature of the site, users can communicate with strangers, either through the Q&A boards, spaces or via private messages.

Private messaging can be turned off in settings and users can block other users.

Quora is a platform where users can post publicly. If your child is using this site, then please ensure your child understands that they should not share personal information. As content is user generated, talk to your child about how information they read online may not be factually correct. Your child may also come across content and topics that are not age appropriate.

Grand Theft Auto (GTA)

Rockstar have announced they are working on Grand Theft Auto 6 (although no release date has been confirmed yet), so this is just a reminder that GTA is rated 18+ by PEGI, largely because of bad language, violence, glamourisation of crime and the depiction of drugs. **GTA** is not suitable for those under this age.



Grand Theft Auto can be played across a range of devices, such as Xbox and PlayStation.

Grand Theft Auto Online is a multi-player version of the game and is included with Grand Theft Auto 5. Players can play this version alone, or they can invite players to a game, or be involved in games with random players. The settings can be changed so you only play with those on your approved friends list.

What do I need to be aware of?

- Mature content the content is unsuitable for children
- In game chat (although this can be disabled and other players can be muted (depending on the device and version)).
- In game spending

It is important to talk to your child regularly about what they are playing and to discuss with them why some games are just not appropriate for them to play and the importance of checking age ratings.

What can they play instead?

Online Challenges

Our children may not have developed the skills and ability to critically analyse all situations yet so it is important to talk to your child about hoaxes and challenges that may appear on the internet. Some challenges are fun and provide no risk, however there will be challenges that are risky/dangerous. Your child may see others complete certain challenges online without



being harmed and therefore may want to repeat them and not consider the potential risks to themselves. Make sure they know that they should talk to you (or another trusted adult) about what they see online, particularly if they plan to try a challenge or if something scares or upsets them.

We would always advise that if your child has not heard about an online challenge, then do not draw attention to it as this may lead to them searching for it out of curiosity, so just talk about challenges in a general sense. Reassure your child that challenges that suggest that bad things will happen if they do not complete the tasks are not real.

Sextortion

Sextortion is a form of blackmail; it occurs when somebody threatens to publish a sexual image/video of them unless they do what the blackmailer says (usually send money). The blackmailer may have originally tricked the person into sharing a sexual image or the image may have been obtained without the victim's knowledge or consent. Unfortunately, teenagers have been the victims of sextortion, so it is important to chat to your child about this topic. We understand that it can be difficult to approach such conversations but 'Thorn for Parents' have created conversation starters as well as a script to help you to start the conversation: https://parents.thorn.org/guides/sextortion/
