Dear Parent/Guardian,

On Monday we held our new Year 7 Induction Day where over 180 pupils joined us for their first experience of life at Broughton High School. After their first assembly where pupils met their new Head of Year, Mrs Boardman, pupils were split into their form groups and met their new Form Tutors. Following this, our new pupils had their first classroom experiences in a variety of subjects. As expected, the pupils loved the food at break and lunch and it was lovely to see so many pupils from different primary schools mixing with each other and starting to build new friendships. All new Year 7 parents were invited to attend an induction evening at the end of the day and it was a pleasure to welcome so many new families to our school. We are all really looking forward to working with both the pupils and their families when we return to school in September.

Today we took 700 pupils to Blackpool Pleasure Beach and Blackpool Zoo for the end of year rewards trips. It was wonderful to see the children so excited this morning to spend a day out of school with their friends. The visits were a great success and the pupils behaviour and conduct was superb.

Last weekend saw the conclusion of this year's Duke of Edinburgh expeditions. It has been a superb course again this year and I want to say a huge thankyou and well done to all the pupils and staff involved with the Award scheme this year. A special thank you to Mr Lowe who leads the whole process in school for us.

Year 10 pupils have taken the opportunity this week to visit Preston, Newman and Runshaw College to start the process of deciding their pathway for the next stage of their educational journey when they leave Broughton in June 2024. Miss Cross coordinated the three trips and reported that the pupils behaved exceptionally well and engaged fully in the opportunities on offer. I am sure this will have helped pupils with the start of this very important decision.

Next week our Year 10 pupils embark on their work experience placements which is the first time for a number of years. Mr Lord, Head of Careers has coordinated an excellent programme for the pupils which includes 3 days of work experience in a variety of settings from Primary and Secondary Schools to BAE Systems and landscaping. I know this will be a valuable experience for pupils and I wish them all the very best of luck for their three-day placements.

The 'Geography Field Trip' to Liverpool this week proved to be an excellent day for the huge number of pupils in Year 10 who are studying Geography GCSE. As well as studying the development of the city, pupils experienced a ferry trip on the Mersey to observe the view of the city and its skyline from the river. Although it was an extremely wet day, and Mr Brady and Mr Lord suffered quite badly with sea sickness whilst on the ferry, the pupils found the experience extremely valuable and helpful with the completion of their GCSE studies. Thank you to Mrs Wortley for organising and supervising this visit.

If your child cycles to/from school, please remind them of the importance of road awareness and safety. Pupils must always pay attention to pedestrians and road users, and they should always stop and check for oncoming traffic at junctions and use any crossing when available.

All pupils who cycle to school must wear a helmet at all times on their journey to and from school. It is strongly advisable for all the pupils to use the cycling lanes and guild wheel to make their way into school wherever possible. If your child walks to school, please remind them also of the importance of road safety and to use pedestrian crossings where available.

This week we appointed Mr Chris Banks to join our team in September as a Pastoral Intervention Mentor. Chris brings a wealth of experience to our team here at Broughton and we are looking forward to working with him in the new academic year.

Good luck in advance to all pupils and staff who are involved with the Music trip to Austria, departing on Saturday. I know it will be an amazing experience for all involved.

The final day will be non-uniform for pupils and we would like to ask for a donation of £1 to this term's chosen charity which is Sir Tom Finney House. Your son or daughter must wear clothing appropriate for a day in school and we are of course still upholding all the rules regarding jewellery, make-up, fake tan etc. We will also be holding our end of year awards assemblies for each year group where pupils will receive recognition for their hard work and effort both in class and their contribution to school life. School will finish at 1pm.

Mrs Janet Englishby, our school business manager, has taken the decision to retire at the end of the school year. Janet has worked tirelessly over the last thirteen years here at Broughton High School managing our school budget, planning and supervising all the amazing building projects around school and coordinating our school catering alongside a number of other important roles including being a key member of our school senior leadership team.
