As you are aware, the school had a full Ofsted Inspection, earlier this term on Tuesday 27<sup>th</sup> September and Wednesday 28<sup>th</sup> September 2022. We were visited by a team of four inspectors who conducted an extremely rigorous process of visiting a significant number of lessons, speaking to staff, pupils and governors and scrutinising our whole school curriculum. I am now able to share the report with you and the outcome of our full Section 5 Graded Inspection.






