Dear Parent/Guardian,

This week in assemblies I have spoken to all pupils about the theme of Remembrance. Remembrance is an important part of our calendar that gives us time to stop and reflect on those who have made sacrifices or who have been affected by war or conflict. I explained to pupils that 'remembrance' reminds us of the ongoing confrontations, hostilities and tensions that still occur daily around the world and the importance of the need for us all to work together in school, to promote harmony amongst friendship groups and to speak positively and kindly to one another. Today, we had two minutes of silence at 11.00am to commemorate Remembrance Day followed by the 'The Last Post'. Shortly afterwards, Mr Church, Mrs Gledhill and Mr Hedingham, joined our Head Boy, Head Girl, their Deputies and a number of our pupils who are cadets and they laid a wreath on behalf of the school at the Broughton memorial.

Next week we will be holding our Annual Awards Evening. Our former Year 11 pupils will be returning to school with their families to receive their GCSE certificates, subject prizes and special awards. We will be joined by Helen Clitheroe, former pupil at Broughton High School, Olympian and now athletics coach who will address the pupils and present the prizes. We are all looking forward to welcoming our former pupils and their families back to school. Please remember that school will be closed the following day as one of our annual INSET days. School will re-open on Monday 21st November.

Assemblies next week continue our theme of keeping pupils safe and we will be raising awareness of knife crime and the harm that this can cause. This is a theme that Preston schools have been raising awareness around for a number of years and we will be joined by PC Roxby from Lancashire Police who will lead the assembly.

Members of our pupil council visited the Preston Maternity unit on Wednesday to deliver our cheque from the recent 'reward point' fundraising to the Baby Beat Appeal. Thank you to all the pupils in school for their efforts in achieving reward points that convert into money for a number of worthy causes and charities throughout the year.

Thank you to all parents who have returned the voting papers for the appointments of our new Parent Governors. The deadline for all returns is 12 noon on Monday 14<sup>th</sup> November. Once the votes have been counted and checked I will inform you of the outcome and the names of the new members of our governing body.

On Thursday 24<sup>th</sup> November, we will be holding our annual 'Careers Fair' in the school gym. The careers fair will be held from 8.40am to 13.20pm. We are looking to inspire our pupils with role models from all sectors, to draw links between learning and the world of work and to support them to make better informed decisions about their futures. Your business does not necessarily need to offer post-16 options but your input may help our pupils take their next step. The careers fair will be open to pupils in all years; there will be 30 minute sessions with approximately 90 pupils attending at any one time. Pupils in each session will have a maximum of 30 minutes to speak to the various volunteers, therefore pupils will make their own decision on who they would like to speak to, based on their own interests and aspirations. We would love to see representatives bring in any props, photos, promotional materials etc to create an immersive experience. All pupils will be emailed an evaluation form from the day which will help us plan for future events. If you have any feedback from your child's experience please contact Mr Lord.






#### Remembrance
