Dear Parent/Guardian,

It has been an extremely busy week of school trips, visits, drama performances and sporting fixtures with a huge number of pupils experiencing different opportunities to learn outside of the classroom. We have held a wide variety of extra-curricular activities and had a huge number of pupils attending running club last night! On Monday, author Tom Palmer visited and spoke to Year 7 and 8 about his books, his journey into writing and where he gets his ideas and inspiration from. His books have always been popular in the school library but borrowing figures have increased even further since his visit.

On Tuesday morning, Year 11 were treated to an excellent performance of 'A Christmas Carol' by an external drama company to help them prepare for their upcoming GCSE examinations. It was essential for the pupils to see the story brought to life through a drama performance and speaking to a number of Year 11 pupils it was reassuring to find that they thought the performance was extremely beneficial for their understanding.

Yesterday, some of our Year 10 pupils studying Triple Science attended the GCSE Science Live event at Manchester Opera House. Pupils had the chance to listen to talks delivered by five of Britain's top scientists, who all work at the cutting edge of their specialisms: Professor Robert Winston, Dr. Kate Lancaster, Dr. Hannah Critchlow, Dr. Anna Ploszajski and Dr. Tim Gabriel. There was also a session run by an experienced GCSE Science examiner focusing on exam technique. The event was very thought-provoking and an excellent opportunity for our pupils to meet top scientists; I am sure all the pupils who attended will have been inspired by what they heard.

Congratulations to the Year 10 football team who beat Morecambe High School 1-0 to progress to the next round of the Lancashire Cup. The Year 8 Basketball team travelled to Longridge High School to play in a tournament on Tuesday. The team beat Corpus Christi 25-8 and lost 22-14 to Longridge. On Wednesday our Year 7 girls' football team played against Shuttleworth High School; Broughton won the match with a final score of 2:0. As well as these fixtures, there was excellent participation at American Football, Basketball, Hockey and table tennis clubs throughout the week.

Assemblies this week have focused on the importance of 'engagement' and 'giving your best'. Mr Webster spoke to all year groups sharing some valuable advice about working hard and concentrating in every lesson and taking part in activities outside of the classroom whenever possible. I know that the pupils will take this advice on board and apply it wherever possible in school.

I will be writing to all Year 11 parents next week to share the schedule as we progress towards the final exams. Following the successful Mock Exam results day last week, we will be holding our Year 11 Parents' Evening on Thursday 8th February. We will be launching the Year 11 online 'Revision Hub' on Monday 19th February and starting the 6-period day revision period for all pupils. Mr Church has written to all parents regarding the 6 period day. We will be holding a Year 11 'Final Preparation for Exams' meeting for parents on Thursday 21st March. More detail on all of these events will be shared in my letter.

Please encourage your child to work towards their 'Best of Broughton Award' (2023-24). We have already awarded a significant number of the new silver badges for this year but want to ensure that all pupils strive to achieve this prestigious award by the end of the academic year. A reminder of the list of things to achieve throughout the academic year is below:

- 1. Achieve at least a bronze award for academic and pastoral achievement in school.
- 2. Have great attendance: This must be across a term.
- 3. Evidence of reading at least 3 extra-curricular books from our reading lists.
- 4. Support a parents' evening, open night or event that shows willingness and commitment.
- 5. Attend a club or team activity over a minimum of 4 sessions.
- 6. Support a charity by promoting or helping raise funds.
- 7. Help out in a chosen area of school in the pupil's own time.
- 8. Feature in the school newsletter or receive a praise postcard.

I mentioned in last week's newsletter about the importance of attendance. Broughton's attendance figures continue to be significantly above the national average. Our whole school attendance figure is currently 95.6% which is higher than at the same point last year. Please find each year groups attendance figures below:





GAMES & GRAPHICS TASTER WORKSHOP




