Dear Parent/Guardian,

As the end of half term arrives I would like to say thank you to the whole school community for your efforts and hard work over the last 7 weeks. Firstly, I am extremely grateful to you, our parents, for the continued support that you show the school and for helping us maintain our high expectations and standards on a daily basis. Whether this be ensuring your child wears their uniform correctly or checking that homework is completed on time, through to supporting extra-curricular activities and parents' evenings. Your involvement in school is greatly appreciated and never taken for granted. Secondly, I would like to thank all members of staff, governors and members of the PTFA here at Broughton High School. Their efforts to go the extra mile in all areas of school life and do their very best every day for our pupils is truly impressive. Finally, our pupils who work very hard on a day to day basis, always aiming to give their best in all that they do. I am amazed daily by their excellent behaviour, their commitment to their studies, their manners around school, their commitment to 'getting involved' and their infectious positivity in general. As I mentioned in last week's newsletter the Mock Exams are fast approaching for our Year 11 pupils. Please can I remind you that we have a large number of items of 'new unused' and 'good as new' uniform available to purchase in school. Thank you to everyone who has donated so far. Road safety continues to be a real concern, especially at this time of year. We repeatedly tell the pupils about cycling and crossing the road safely but we still see examples of pupils dangerously crossing the road at Woodplumpton Road, Garstang Road and outside the Co-op. Please remind your child about the importance of crossing over roads safely and not being on their mobile phones when they are crossing. Below you can find the 'Green Cross Code' which I am sure we all remember from our own childhood! Please take a moment to share this with your child.

1. Think

Find a safe place to cross the road. If you can't see a crossing, remember to cross where you can see in all directions and where drivers will see you.

2. Stop

Just before you get to the kerb, stop. Stand on the pavement near the kerb and make sure that you can see the traffic. DO NOT step on to the road.

3. Look

Look all around you for traffic. Make sure that you listen carefully for traffic that you can't see. Check to your right-hand side first, then check to your left and then to your right again before you cross.

4. Wait

If traffic is coming, let it pass. If you are waiting at a crossing then wait until the cars have stopped or the green man shows, before you cross. If you are not at a crossing, wait until it is safe to cross. Once the traffic has passed, look around again and listen.

5. Look and listen again

When it is safe and there is no traffic, walk straight across the road. Keep looking and listening while you cross the road. Watch out for cyclists, motorcyclists and horse riders. Always walk straight across the road, DO NOT walk diagonally. NEVER run across the road because you might fall over and you might not get up in time.

6. Arrive alive

Look, and keep looking, while you cross the road.

I hope you all manage to have a restful and peaceful half term and I look forward to seeing all the pupils return to school on Monday 30<sup>th</sup> October.
