

Homework in Business Studies

All Business Studies homework is purposeful and supports learning. It is never set for the sake of setting homework. Business Studies homework should be accessible for all pupils.

If a pupil fails to meet a homework deadline, or if homework is completed to a poor standard, a warning will be issued on Synergy in the first instance. If this happens again in the same half term, the pupil will be given a detention with the class teacher. The intention of this detention is not to be punitive but rather to support the pupil in completing the work on time and to the required standard.

What does homework in GCSE Business Studies look like?

GCSE Business homework is closely tied to GCSE preparation. It includes tasks such as learning key vocabulary, reading, researching, revising, maintaining comprehensive and up-to-date notes and practicing exam-style questions.

Additionally, pupils may be tasked with creating revision resources and watching business-related television programmes. Pupils will need to make use of Seneca Learning, Quizlet and Blooket as platforms for revision and learning vocabulary. Pupils who do not have access to ICT at home are able to use school facilities and specifically attend the Business 'Homework Help' session on a Tuesday evening after school.

Pupils will usually receive one piece of homework a week which should take approximately 35-40 minutes to complete. Pupils are usually given a week, although it may be slightly shorter depending on timetabling. However, pupils will be given a minimum of two nights to complete the homework task.
