Introduction

We encourage parents to engage in careers dialogue with their child and help them navigate their way through the various options post-16. This page will provide you with information to help your child make informed decisions on their future career, whilst providing information on how school help shape their decisions.

The law now states that children need to continue in education until at least their 18th birthday.

This does not mean that they must stay in school. You can choose from the following options (Click on the blue highlighted linked items to access further advice and information from external providers):

- School sixth forms across Lancashire offer a range of courses
- A_university technical college for 14 19 year olds. It specialises in technical studies and is sponsored by employers and universities.
- A college or course near you
- A pre-apprenticeship
- An apprenticeship
- Part-time education or training alongside a job or volunteering (working/volunteering for more than 20 hours a week)
- A job-related course through a training provider

Your child can also contact the National Careers Service or Lancashire County Council's Employment and Support Team.

Employability development

At Broughton High School, we believe that careers and information guidance is far more than pointing pupils in the direction of a job or career path. As such the careers programme is designed to develop your child's employability skills and work readiness. Programmes such as Employability Masterclass delivered by Young Enterprise Company, offer expert guidance on CV writing, personal brand and interview technique. We hold annual mock interviews for our year 11's, therefore they gain experience of this situation and presents a fine opportunity for your child to showcase their employability.

Work Experience

Our Work Experience programme will be held in the summer term. All of year 10 will have the opportunity to gain vital experience of the work place. The placement is designed only to be an introduction to the world of work and often takes the form of observing qualified professionals or work shadowing. Although it may serve to confirm or deny a career aspiration, there are other valuable reasons for undertaking this experience. These include generating awareness of an environment outside the familiarity of school, building initiative and strengthening communications skills. It therefore not essential that pupils undertake a placement that is carried out within the industry area in which pupils wish to pursue a career. Parents of Year 10 pupils can expect correspondence regarding Work Experience within the final weeks of the autumn term.

There are seven sectors of employment that have been identified as growth sectors in the Lancashire area. Below is a video providing more information on the Labour Market Information for our area.




Careerometer

Careerometer is a simple way for you to find out more about a specific industry and career. It is a useful tool which enables your son/daughter to compare pay, working hours and future employment prospects of job roles in the UK.

The Careerometer widget can be used to explore and compare key information about occupations to support the process of identifying potential careers.

How to use the Careerometer

The data is organised by occupation. Simply type in the job your child is interested in below and then select it from the drop-down menu. More options can be added to compare which route you would prefer to go down.
