My First Day

Your first day at secondary school will be one you will always remember so follow these steps to make it a success!

The night before:

Have your bag packed - check you have all the correct equipment.

Have your named uniform laid out ready.

Check that you know how you are getting to and from school.

Set your alarm to allow you plenty of time to get up and ready.

On your first day: There will only be Year 7 and Year 11 in school

Start your first day with a good breakfast and leave the house ready to arrive at school before 8.40am.

When you arrive, you will greeted by members of staff and pupil mentors/prefects. If you are arriving on a school bus you will come straight into the school grounds.

You will have a welcome assembly with your year group, before spending the rest of the morning with your tutor group. It is important to listen carefully to all the information being given.

After the morning with your Form Tutor, it will be time for your first lessons.

On your first day you will have a number of lessons before the school day finishes at 3.00pm.

You will be given your timetable and there will be plenty of people around to point you in the right direction.

You will have your photograph taken in the afternoon and be with your tutor group to discuss how your first day has been.

School Meals

We know you are going to enjoy your break and lunch times at Broughton. We have numerous outlets and a wonderful variety of food on offer.





We operate a cashless catering system which means you don't need to bring money into school. Your parents will have an account on ParentPay into which they can add money for you to spend. Please check your account each Sunday evening to make sure you have enough money for the week. There is a daily spending limit so you can't overspend!

When using our dining facilities, please make sure you don't leave any litter lying around and always make sure you clear your table.

You can choose how many days you want to visit our dining rooms. You can visit every day or once or twice a week; the choice is yours. Chip day is always popular!

At break time we serve from two dining halls. The Junior for Years 7 and 8 and the Senior for 9 and 10. Our Year 11 have their own lounge.

At lunch time you can choose which outlet you wish to visit. We have:

Two dining halls with a serving hatch and a Pasta stand.

An outdoor Kiosk.

A Deli which offers indoor and outdoor seating.



Keeping You Safe at Broughton

We have an email address and QR Code which allows pupils to voice any concerns they may have about issues such as friendships, well-being or exam stress. The QR code will be available for pupils to use from September.

Keeping You Safe at Broughton

At Broughton, we have a school environment where every pupil can aspire, enjoy, and achieve. We take pride in listening to all our pupils and ensuring that they feel supported on a daily basis to enable them to 'Achieve Together'.



Physical bullying

Hitting, kicking, slapping, pinching, spitting, tripping, pushing, blocking. Stealing or destroying someone's possessions. Making mean or rude hand gestures.

Verbal bullying

Name calling.

Insults.

Teasing.

Intimidation.

Homophobic or racist remarks. Inappropriate sexual comments.

Taunting.

Social bullying

Lying and spreading rumours.

Leaving someone out on purpose

Telling others not to be friends with someone. Embarrasing someone in public.

Damaging someone's reputation or relationships.

Cyber bullying

Posting/sending hurtful emails or posts, images or videos.

Making online threats.

Imitating others online or using their log-in. Deliberately excluding others online.

Spreading nasty gossip or rumours.

Remarks of a sexual nature about a person's clothing, personal behaviour or body.

Sexually explicit statements, questions, jokes or anecdotes.

Requesting sexual favours or dates

Spreading rumours about a person's personal or sexual life. Coercion of a sexual activity by threat of punishment.

Excessive and unwelcomed flirting.

Physical

Impeding or blocking a person's physical movement.

Inappropriate and unwanted touching of a person and/or their clothing.

Other inappropriate touching including kissing, hugging, patting, stroking or rubbing. Playing music with offensive or degrading language.

Purposely brushing up against another person.

Non-verbal

Looking a person's body up and down.

Making derogatory gestures or facial expressions of a sexual nature.

Frequently following or standing too close to a person on purpose. Whistling or staring in a sexually suggestive or offensive manner.

Displaying sexually suggestive objects, pictures, cartoons, posters, calendars or computer screens.

Showing other people sexually suggestive text messages or emails.

Sharing sexually inappropriate images or videos, such as pornography with co-workers.

Rewards

Bronze, Silver and Gold Awards

Every day in school you can achieve Synergy rewards points for a variety of reasons e.g. excellent work, helping out and great homework.



Each point goes towards your total points achieved across the year. Pupils who achieve 100 points will receive a Bronze Award, 200 points a Silver Award and 300 points a Gold Award. In addition, all pupil Synergy points will contribute towards our termly chosen charity donation.

Best of Broughton Award

A unique award at Broughton is our Best of Broughton Award. Each year you can work towards achieving this by completing our 8 challenges.

The challenges are based upon qualities we expect of all our pupils and therefore can be achieved by everyone. The challenges the pupils should complete are shown opposite. Once you have completed all eight you will receive a certificate and unique badge to wear on your blazer in school.



- Achieve at least a **bronze award** for your academic and pastoral achievement in school.
- Have great attendance; this must be across a term.
- Evidence of **reading** at least 3 extracurricular **books**.
- Support a parents' evening, open night or event that shows willingness and commitment.
- Attend a club or **team activity** over a minimum of 4 sessions.
- 6. Support a **charity** by promoting or helping raise funds.
- Help out in a chosen area of school in your own time.
- 8. Feature in the **school newsletter** or receive a **praise postcard**.
