Curriculum

The school offers an exciting curriculum, including a full range of National Curriculum subjects and an impressive breadth of GCSE or equivalent vocational qualifications, ensuring every pupil follows a broad, balanced and relevant curriculum, to suit their individual needs and aspirations.

We have high expectations of our pupils at all times and place teaching and learning at the very centre of school life.

Our curriculum promotes the spiritual, moral, cultural, mental and physical development of pupils at the school and of our modern British society and prepares them for the opportunities, responsibilities and experiences of later life.

Our school timetable comprises 25 one-hour teaching periods per week for each year group.

Key Stage 3 (Years 7, 8, 9)

During their first three years at Broughton, pupils follow subjects according to the National Curriculum. As well as the 'core subjects' of



English, Mathematics and Science, the pupils also study the 'foundation subjects' of Art, Computing, Design and Technology, Drama, Humanities (History, Geography & Religious Education) Languages (French & German), Music, Physical Education, together with Citizenship, Personal, Social and Health Education (CPSHE).

Key Stage 4 (Years 10, 11)

In Year 10 and Year 11, pupils work towards predominantly GCSE qualifications. They follow a core curriculum of English Language, English Literature, Mathematics, Science, Physical Education and RE/ CPSHE. Pupils then have a choice of option subjects from a guided option scheme. We offer a range of GCSE courses, but recognise that

some pupils require a personalised curriculum to meet their needs and alternative courses, including vocational qualifications, may be appropriate.

Pupils studying separate Sciences choose three additional subjects and are guided to the Ebacc criteria. Whilst pupils studying Combined Science choose four additional subjects and have the opportunity to fulfil the Ebacc criteria.

At both Key Stage 3 and 4 we recognise that careers education and guidance form an important part of the curriculum. A variety of support and advice, including an independent careers advisor and other external sources, is provided to help pupils progress into further education, training or work.

The Learning Support Department ensures that pupils who require additional support due to physical, learning or behavioural difficulties, or whose attendance at school has been affected because of health reasons, have their needs fully met whilst being able to access a comprehensive and inclusive curriculum.



Code of Conduct



We should work to the best of our ability in all aspects of school life and allow and encourage others to achieve their best by:

- Moving around the school in a responsible and sensible way keeping to the left in corridors
- Behaving in a sensible manner at all times
- Bringing appropriate equipment to all lessons
- Respecting other people's right to learn and express their opinions
- Always completing and handing in homework promptly
- Following instructions given by teachers, other adults in school and senior pupils on duty
- Working quietly in class unless directed otherwise by a teacher.

We should show care and consideration towards other people and show respect to them and their property by:

- Remaining polite and courteous to everyone in our school community
- Knowing how to behave in a fire drill and when the alarm rings leaving the building sensibly and quietly as instructed
- Remembering that glass bottles, energy drinks and cans are not allowed in school
- Not wearing coats in school
- Remembering that aerosols are not allowed because they are dangerous
- Not eating sweets and food in school, other than in the dining areas

- Remembering that chewing gum is not allowed
- Leaving valuable items at home
- Remembering that mobile phones may be brought into school but must be switched off, and out of sight, whilst on school site
- The use of any picture/video taking facility is forbidden in school or on school related activities unless authorised by a member of staff
- School related information/videos/ pictures should not be posted on the internet without authorisation from school.

We should enhance our own reputation and that of the school by:

- Wearing full uniform correctly at all times
- Skirts must be worn at the knee
- Only wearing a watch and a single pair of small, plain stud earrings as a maximum amount of jewellery. Any other facial or body piercing is not allowed
- Not wearing make-up, false tan, false eyelashes, nail varnish or nail extensions
- Putting litter in the bin
- Accepting responsibility for our own behaviour at all times in and out of class and on visits out of school
- Ensuring hair colouring is natural and discreet. Extreme hairstyles, cuts and adornments are inappropriate for school.

School Uniform

Broughton uniform is as follows:

Navy school blazer with logo, school tie, optional navy V neck jumper with green piping and school logo. Plain black or blue coat.

Navy pleated knee-length skirt with logo or Navy school trousers with logo Plain navy or black tights or plain navy socks No ankle socks No leggings or socks over tights Plain white shirt with stiffened collar (not fitted) Sensible plain black shoes, not canvas, no trainers, no logos (heel not to exceed 5cms)

Grey trousers with logo Plain white shirt with stiffened collar (not fitted) Plain black or grey socks Sensible plain black shoes, not canvas, no trainers, no logos

The following are not permitted items of uniform:-

Sweatshirts; hoodies; scarves; boots; trainers; tracksuit tops; baseball caps; denim or leather jackets. Expensive designer coats/jackets should not be brought into school. Coats need to be plain black or blue and not worn inside the school building.

All items of clothing and footwear should be clearly marked with the name of the pupil so they may be identified and returned if lost.

The services shown below operate to and from the school car park. Regular public service buses link Bilsborrow and Barton with the school. Another regular service from outside the school gate links us to Goosnargh.

A late bus service **(403)** operates every Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday from mid-September to early July, at a charge of 60p per pupil per journey (pupils are able to use their bus passes and return tickets). This enables pupils to stay late to complete school work or participate in activities after school. The bus leaves the school premises at 4.25pm and arrives at the Anderton Arms at 5.17pm. The bus goes via the following areas: Woodplumpton Lane, Whittle Hill, Woodplumpton Village, Tabley Lane, Nog Tow, Tom Benson Way, Merry Trees Lane (Ancient Oak) Cottam, Tom Benson Way, Tanterton Hall Road, Tag Lane, Woodplumpton Road, Cadley Causeway, Black Bull Lane, Sharoe Green Lane, Sherwood Way, Eastway (Asda), Longsands Lane, Anderton Arms.

Parents who bring and collect their children by car are requested **not** to bring the cars into the school grounds as the total parking area in front of the school is required by the school buses and the area at the back of the school via Sandygate Lane is a staff car park and sports area.

Pupils may come to school by bicycle provided that they have a cycle helmet. Cyclists bring and store their cycles on the school premises at their own risk. It is recommended that cycles are insured and must be secured while on site with an appropriate cycle lock.
